BROWN CEMETERY

Located NW Sect. 32 Twp. 27S. Rge. 25 E.

From the NW corner of Sect. 32, on highway 69, go almost .2 mi. E, then about 500 ft. S on a steep little hill. The cem. is fenced and kept in excellent condition. It is about 75 ft. square, and there is one cedar tree and several oaks.

The home of Mr. & Mrs.AJames is a short distance farther east of the above corner of Sect. 32 on S side of road. Those buried in the cem. are not of their family, the farm having originally been owned by Brawns. The cem. was reach d on foot across a pasture from the James home. Mrs. James stated that the highway dept. helps maintain the cem., and a Mr. brown from Ft. Scott comes several times a year to help. She said Mrs. Clarence Prideaux of Pittsburg was a Brown, and her mother was buried there. Also Mrs. Martha Nelson of Pittsburg is the dau.

of John & Lydia Birdsell, nee Brown, who are buried there

This cem. is about 1 mi E, ½ mi S & 1 mi. E from Cato.

Note: 3-27-1971 Mrs. Martha Nelson, Pittsburg Ks.:
This cem. is a family cem. of the Brown family, and all buried here are related. The Strouds and Endicotts were related to the Browns. Mrs. Nelson's parents were John & Lydia Birdsell. Lizzie Brown m 2nd (Albert?) Hill, and he is also buried here. The metal stake "Endicott" is at the grave of (Mim?) Endicott, and the 3 other rocks mark graves of Endicott infants. The original owner of the farm was John Brown.

10-14-1972: Mrs. Bert Marshall, nee Opal Palmer, dau. of Wm. B. Palmer who built the house where Tom James lives, moved back to Girard 4 yrs. ago after living 30 yrs. in Wichita. She grew up on this farm. Her father ran the general store at Drywood for a time, was not the first to run it, however. His mother died of smallpox when he was 3 weeks old and he was raised by the parents of "Aunt Lou" Brown, and he inherited the farm although he was no actual relation. His father was taking him someplace & stopped in at Browns and they kept him. The John L. Brown family went to Oklahoma for a time during the Civil War because they were so close to Missouri, and being on the side of the Union were in danger from raiders from Missouri. Several other families left also, including some of the Coonrods. It is a Mr. Birdsell from Ft. Scott, not Brown, who attends to this cem. Mrs. Martha Nelson a dau. of John & Lydia Birdsell, nee Brown. Minnie Stroud a dau. of Joseph S. and g-dau. of John L. B rown.
