Brief Summary of Order No. 3

To mitigate the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) in Crawford County, Kansas, and pursuant to the authority provided in K.S.A. 65-129b, K.S.A. 65-202 and other applicable laws and regulations, this Order No. 3 is issued.

Governor's Executive Order No. 20-68

Effective at 12:01am on Wednesday, November 25, 2020, all businesses or organizations in Kansas must require all employees, customers, visitors, members, or members of the public to wear a face covering when:

- Employees are working in any space visited by customers or members of the public, regardless of whether anyone from the public is present at the time.
- Employees are working in any space where food is prepared or packaged for sale or distribution to others.
- Customers, members, visitors, or members of the public are in a facility managed by the business or organization.
- Employees are in any room or enclosed area where other people (except for individuals who reside together) are present and are unable to maintain a 6-foot distance except for infrequent or incidental moments of closer proximity.

Business Restrictions:

Businesses and other locations that are open shall comply with the following additional restrictions. For purposes of the Order No. 3, all businesses and locations are required to comply with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) "Interim Guidance for Businesses and Employers Responding to Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19), May 2020" and industry-specific guidance from trade groups. Nothing in this order shall be interpreted to require that any business or location open if they choose not to.

1. It is strongly recommended that all employers screen each employee prior to each shift. It is strongly recommended any such screening include asking about symptoms, travel, and checking temperature.
2. All front line staff who are in contact with the public or are involved with food or drink prep or delivery are required to wear masks.
3. All restaurants and bars are limited to seated areas only. This includes patios.

- Service or consumption of food or drinks while standing at a counter/bar or standing-only areas is prohibited.
 - Consumption of food and beverages shall only take place at a counter or table via seated service.
 - Dance floors (including but not limited to temporary spaces obtained by removing tables or other objects for the purpose to allow all people to dance) shall be closed.
4. All seated parties must be placed at least 6 feet apart from other seated parties (between table and/or booths), or when that is not feasible a barrier such as plexiglass or other partition shall divide booths or tables closer than 6 feet.
5. Event Centers/Community Events:
- Must adhere to social distancing guidelines (participants 6-feet apart) and the wearing of cloth masks is required except as outlined and approved in their mitigation plan and as provided in Governor's Executive Order 20-52.
 - The entity organizing the event is responsible for submitting a remediation plan to the Crawford County Health Department at jgoedeke@crawfordcohd.org no later than one week prior to the event.
 - Hand sanitizer should be readily available throughout the premises for the duration of the event.
 - School activities have been previously vetted by the local health officer(s) and are not subject to this Order.

Law Enforcement

Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-129b, any sheriff, deputy sheriff, or other law enforcement officer of the state or any political subdivision within Crawford County, Kansas, is hereby ordered to assist in the execution or enforcement of this order. Specifically law enforcement witnessing violations of this order or responding to complaints shall provide a written narrative to the County Attorney's Office describing the violation(s) in detail. A business found by law enforcement to be in violation of this Order will initially receive a written Notice of Violation and will be given an opportunity to correct the violation. Subsequent violations will be turned over to the County Attorney for prosecution. Local health officers have the final determination regarding further business restrictions and/or closures.

Any business failing to comply with any of the above requirements may face further limitations of business service up to and including closure of business. Any business closed pursuant to this Order must submit a remediation plan to the health department at jgoedeke@crawfordcohd.org and be inspected before reopening.
