The Crawford County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to Kansas Statutes.

Annotated Chapter 19, Article 2, Section 18 in due and regular session with open doors.

Commissioner Tom Moody served as the presiding officer.

Commissioner Bruce Blair was in attendance.

County Clerk Lisa Lusker and County Counselor Jim Emerson were seated with the Board.

Chairman Moody led the pledge of allegiance.

Item One: Ms. Phyllis Bitner & Ms. Linda Roberts from Miners Hall Museum addressed the Commissioners. Ms. Linda Roberts stated that she is the Chairman of the Miners Hall Museum and introduced Ms. Phyliss Bitner and stated that she is the treasurer of the museum and co-chairman of the Dragline Committee. Ms. Roberts discussed the museum bringing a Page 618 Walking Dragline into Crawford County and explained what the dragline is. She gave background information on the museum. She discussed the Smithsonian Exhibit that was hosted by Miners Hall Museum and stated that this exhibit brought in over 5,000 visitors to Southeast Kansas from 38 states and 5 foreign counties in a 6-week period. Ms. Roberts stated that herself and the co-chairs for the dragline, Ms. Bitner and Dr. Chris Childers traveled to Hutchinson to receive a special grant. She explained that Miners Hall Museum was awarded a State Tourism Attraction Sub Grant (TASK) in the amount of \$225,000. She said that the State also obtained a \$112,500 for the museum from the Patterson Foundation and Ms. Roberts gave background information on this foundation. Ms. Roberts explained where the Page 619 Walking Dragline will be located and the plans for it to be a tourist attraction. She spoke about the Wilkinson Family and their donations to this project. She stated that one stipulation of the TASK grant was to receive matching funds and with the assistance of Mr. Kevin Mitchelson the museum was awarded \$250,000 in matching funds from the John Parolo Foundation. She said that another stipulation of the grant was letters of support and she wanted to thank the Commissioners for their letter of support. Ms. Roberts stated that the Miners Hall Museum is bringing \$587,500 to Crawford County and wanted to thank the Commissioners for their support in helping them to dream big. Commissioner Moody stated that he has been involved since 2012 and it is amazing what these ladies and everyone else involved in the museum has done for this community. Commissioner Moody said that on behalf of the Commissioners he would like to thank everyone involved for their hard work and dedication. Commissioner Blair and Ms. Bitner spoke about the information on social media and the time line in getting the drag line moved and ready.

Item Two: Mr. Randy Bennett addressed the Commissioners asked about Crawford County Fire District #4 merging with the City of Girard Fire Department. Commissioner Blair stated that the Commissioners briefly met with the City of Girard and discussed the issue to determine the terms in helping the Girard Fire Department. Commissioner Blair

discussed what was spoke about in that meeting. He stated that he believes there will be a public forum in the future to discuss the ideas and possible plans of the City of Girard and Crawford County Fire District #4. Mr. Bennett stated that he looked for open meetings that discussed this issue but found none. County Counselor Jim Emerson explained how the Commissioners govern the Fire Districts and the Commissioners should have input into any decisions made in reference to a merger. Mr. Bennett stated that some of the citizens of Girard are concerned about loosing the city fire department. Commissioner Blair discussed the needs with volunteers.

NEW BUSINESS

Item One: County Clerk Lisa Lusker stated that she wanted to remind everyone that Tuesday, November 8, 2022 is the 2022 General Election Day and encouraged everyone to get out and vote. She stated that the polls are open from 7:00 AM until 7:00 PM on Election Day and early voting is still available today until 4:00 PM and until 12:00 noon on Monday in the County Clerk's Office.

Item Two: County Counselor Jim Emerson presented the Kansas Housing Resource Corporation Emergency Solution Grant (ESG CV X) Recipient Request for Reimbursement and Financial Status Report in the amount of \$11,623.00. He stated that this is for the months of July, August and September, 2022 and this is a small additional award from the ESG CV Grant.

On motion (22-393) of Commissioner Blair and the second of Commissioner Moody to approve the Kansas Housing Resource Corporation Emergency Solution Grant (ESG CV X) Recipient Request for Reimbursement and Financial Status Report in the amount of \$11,623.00 and authorize the Chairman to sign.
