McGONIGLE CEMETERY

Located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sect. 12 Twp. 28 S, Range 24 E.

The Hatch School house was located on the SE cor. of the intersection 5 mi E of Highway #7 at Farlington & 1 mi N. This was on the NW cor. of said Sect. 12. The Cemetery is located  $\frac{1}{2}$  mi E of the site of the school, then about  $\frac{1}{4}$  mi. S down a graveled lane. The sign at the lane says "McGonagle Cemetery", but the 3 McGonigles buried there show the other spelling on their stones.

The 1906 Plat Book of Crawford County shows Bone Creek to be a short distance to the S of the cem. A draw or ravine nearly encircles the cem., except at the NW corner where the lane enters, thus brush & trees nearly surround it. The driveway turns & crosses the cem. E-W, dividing it into a N half and a S half, there being a brick tool shed at the E end of this driveway. The S half is the older part and most of the graves are there. The oldest stone being that of Geo. M. Hatch who died Sept 1, 1857. There are many illegible stones, and a number of field rocks that could be older burials, but it seems likely this is the oldest one. In the newer N half, the oldest burial was that of Harvey Simpson who died 1926. The cem. is well kept considering its age & location, apparently has been mowed occasionally, and is used to this day.

Mason Boggs b 1884 lives on a farm Sw of the Hatch school site. He states that the Fairview Baptist Church once stood across the road on the corner W of the school. The McGonigle cem. was not a church cem., but used by the neighborhood, many of whom attended the church. The church was the same Baptist association as Mt. Olive SE of Girard, Round Prairie SW of Girard, and Galena Kansas. A faulty flue in the school house caused a fire which burned both school and church. Mr. Boggs' wife was Martha Dalton. The Dalton, Pearson & Hatch families were related and all came from Iowa together in 1857. George M. Hatch age 12 died Sept 1 1857, and there being no lumber available anywhere, Mr. Hatch tore up his wagon box to build a coffin to bury his son. When the Daltons came in 1857 they moved into a log cabin already built where a Mr. Thomas Pickering had lived. Part of this cabin is still standing today near the residence of Mason Boggs, some of the logs being walnut. It is not known how much earlier than 1857 the cabin was built. It could not be recalled when or how the name McGonigle was given to this cem.

The age of this cem. is emphasized by the fact that we found 15 burials before 1870.

The Register of Deeds office at Girard shows a land patent to the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of above Sect. issued by the U.S. Govt. to Josiah McGonigal on 1-1-1870. Then on 8-3-1870 J.W. McGonigal & wife deeded the S $\frac{1}{2}$  to Jonas Elliott.

12-31-71: Mr. & Mrs. Glenn Ricketts of Liberal Mo. visited Sheffield cem. Mrs. R's father, Loyd Peterson, (she was Alice) is bur. at Sheffield, and her grandparents, Joseph and Sarah Jane Peterson are bur. at McGonigle in unmarked graves, along the far S side, the spot being covered with a thick ground-cover.

8-28-1973: Mason Boggs told that a man named Allen owned the 80 west of the cem., ( $E\frac{1}{2}$  of  $NW\frac{1}{4}$ ) and a man named Bigler owned the  $SE\frac{1}{4}$  of this same sect. Mr. Bigler wanted Mr. Allen's 80, and finally got in a fight with him and Mr. Allen died from the effects of it. Bigler never did get the land.

SOUTH HALF (older part)

Beginning at NE cor. of S  $\frac{1}{2}$ , thence S; thence back S-N on next rows to W. The rows are so crooked we could not follow one row at a time; therefore in places we copied 2 rows at a time, so it will be more difficult to locate a given stone than if the rows could be counted, as 1st, 2nd 3rd etc.
