DIETZ CEMETERY

(Perhaps called Hovefield or perhaps later called Lone Star cem.)

Located on the NE cor of $\mathbb{W}_{2}^{\frac{1}{2}}$ of Sect. 24, Twp. 30S, Rge. 24E. This is 2 mi W of 4th & Broadway, Pittsburg, Kans., to the Lone Star School corner, then $\frac{1}{2}$ mi N & $\frac{1}{4}$ mi E back in field. (Also about $\frac{1}{4}$ mi N of the Helio Mfg. Co. plant.) Approached from the W, across Biancarelli's farm.

A road once passed the cem. on the N side. The site is in a grove of tre s & brush, perhaps about 200 ft. square, fenced on the N & E but open to the S & W. Cattle grazing and vandalism have taken their toll, no stone remains standing. Many stones are broken and the pieces scattered. A number of bases have the stones missing. It appears some burials were removed to other places.

In a map of 1876 with Agricultural Report, Hopefield appears as a town immediately to the NW of this cem., so it could have been called the Hopefield Cem.

3-5-1971: Mr. Oliver Jameson of Girard was born in a house which stood just over ½ mi. N of Lone Star School corner on the E side of the road. A short distance S, also on the E side of the road, on the same 80 acres where the cem. is located, once stood the old stone house built by the Dietz family. Mr. Jameson's parents attended the housewarming in the stone house when it was built many years ago. When it was eventually torn down, the limestone rock was crushed and used on the streets of Pittsburg.

Additional notes by Wm. Cuthbertson 8-24-1971, source: Orval Taylor, R. 2 Girard Ks.

There were 4 Taylor burials made in this cem., one of which was removed later. Orval Taylor's father was Albert, and his grandfather was John Taylor. The wife of John Taylor (Orval's grandmother) Elizabeth Ricks Taylor was buried here and about 20 years later removed to Mt. Olive Cem., Pittsburg, where her grave is marked.

John Tavlor had a brother Job and a half-brother Andrew. The wives of both brothers and an infant son of Job are still buried here. Job died at Burbank, Calif., after having lived in the Dakotas and raised another family.

These are the 3 Taylor burials:

Sarah S. Taylor, nee Grimes, wife of Job Taylor, died 7-28-1876, aged in her 30's. (note: Ortal found her stone still there several yrs. ago, but we did not see it when copying last March)

Ishmael Taylor, baby son of Job & Sarah, age about 12 yrs., d. in 1870's before his mother.

Susan A. Taylor, wife of Andrew Taylor, also died 1876.

3-9-1971: Mrs. Wilse Page, nee Geier, of $5\frac{1}{2}$ mi W. of Pittsburg states that her mother had 2 little brothers who died of scarlet fever not long after the family came in a covered wagon, and both are buried in the "Lone Star" cemetery, but graves were not marked because they could not afford stones in such an early day. They were the children of Ezekiel Thiesing and wife Vashti, nee Davis (who was the dau. of John Davis who m. Mary Pickery 8-29-1838) who were married 5-29-1862. The Thiesing family Bible, owned by Mrs. Page, gives the above info. & the death dates of the 2 children:

Orion W. Thiesing died Nov 4 1868
Gene Thiesing died March 29 1887

Mr. and Mrs. Thiesing are buried in the St.Mary's Catholic Cem. adjoining Highland Park Cem.
