Don,

Representatives from the Miners Hall Museum, the Friends of Historic Girard and the Crawford County Historical Museum did meet on January 19th for about 2 hours. For the most part we discussed the issues of each property and what their overall needs were. I felt it was important for these three museums to get together and realize that they are all working toward similar goals, under similar circumstances. Following the meeting, we decided to get together again and look at funding options. However, before that meeting can I occur, I need to get together with the commissioners and see what funding options are available.

As far as the current funding requests, I see that as separate from this discussion. That funding is something those entities have relied on for years and are expecting, although I'm sure not at the amounts they requested. For some, like the Crawford County Historical Museum, I'm sure the \$55,000 was an effort to get the funding that was discussed in our meeting to fund a full-time position.

As it stands now, all of these entities need some of the funding that is being requested. I'm sure they are hoping for at least what they received last year, if not more. I really see the funding that this "task force" is seeking is above and beyond what is proposed below. If I'm incorrect, then we need to know that. In order to secure legitimate, sustainable funding for these museums, it is going to take much more than a couple of meetings.

Would the commissioners be available, perhaps individually, to discuss what options for funding the museums are available. So far the only option that has been discussed is the transient guest tax, and I'm not so sure that's a viable option, especially considering the backlash it will bring.

I'm available to meet Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday this week.

Item One: County Clerk Don Pyle presenting the January 2015 Clerk's Report. Mr. Pyle stated that it summarizes the total amounts spent by departments for payroll and other bills during the month of January. Mr. Pyle also gave the Commissioners a copy of the December 2014 to January 2015 Clerk's Report of Changes in Expenditures for comparison. Mr. Pyle explained that expenditures for January of each year are much higher than for any other month as annual insurance premiums and several other annual expenses are paid for the entire year. There was a discussion of how the annual premium for insurance is distributed to some of the departments with higher exposures.
