MESSAGES FROM OTHER GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES

Item One: Mr. Mac Young, District Court Administrator addressing 2016 District Court Budget. Mr. Young stated that he had previously discussed that the Legal Defense Attorneys have asked for an increase in their rates and he included that in his budget proposal along with an increase in the cost of utilities. Mr. Young stated that the legal defense attorneys have requested an increase from their current monthly salary of \$1,843 per month to \$2,500 per month which is comparable to the salaries being paid to the attorneys doing the same work in Labette County. Commissioner Murphy was answered that the judges have requested recording equipment for the third courtroom at the Judicial Center in Pittsburg. There was a discussion of the recording equipment that the judges have requested to be installed in the courtroom that was not originally fitted with that equipment at the construction of the facility.

There was a discussion of some of the fees that are collected by district court and how those fees are used. Mr. Young stated that he will get some information on the number of cases being handled by the defense attorneys in Crawford County as compared to the number of cases in the other counties. There was a discussion of the costs for utilities and for adding the recording equipment as well as the cost of janitorial supplies. Commissioner Wood asked if money could be saved by moving all the district court operations to Pittsburg. Mr. Young did not think there is room for all of their operations to be in Pittsburg and that there would be other problems. Mr. Young left the original budget and asked that it be approved by August 15.

CRAWFORD COUNTY DISTRICT COURT BUDGET PROPOSAL BUDGET YEAR – 2016

The budget line items on Office of Judicial Administration form *JA100 and JA101* are required by KSA 20-49. Expenses for court system operations are inherently difficult to predict, as our system costs are dependent in large part on variables, both state and local, beyond the Court's control. Our needs have remained fairly consistent with past years; however, each year contains issues that have presented a challenge and the past two years have been especially difficult due to increases beyond our control.

Although courts are not revenue-producing agencies, fees and other revenues that have accrued or are estimated to accrue are reflected on form *JA100*. For example, revenue supplied to Crawford County from the District Court last year (2014) totaled \$70,306.01.

Again this year, all levels of government find themselves in difficult budget conditions based on the status of the economy at the national, state and local levels. Ending June, 2015 we find that we have expended 53% of the court budget. In 2016 we are proposing an approximate increase of 16% (\$62,350).

Historically the county commission has been very responsive to our assessment of anticipated funds necessary to operate the Crawford County District Court. We welcome the opportunity to present this budget proposal and if there are further questions please feel free to contact our judges, the court clerk or me at any time.



The Commissioners had some questions about the budget and asked that all of the revenue items be reviewed by the County Treasurer. Commissioner Murphy stated that he had discussed some changes to the proposal for the county museums. Mr. Pyle asked the Commissioners to review the budget and they will discuss it further.

UNDER THE HEADING OLD BUSINESS

Item One: Commissioner Murphy wanted to announce that he will be on active duty with his National Guard Unit from August 1 through August 15. Mr. Murphy stated that he would like to have another work session to discuss the Personnel Policy revisions that are being proposed by the group that has been working on this issue. It was decided to have a work session at 9:00 AM on Tuesday, July 14, 2015.

Item Two: Commissioner Murphy regarding a bridge that had been previously identified as qualifying for a partial bridge program through KDOT. Mr. Murphy gave the Commissioners an analysis of the potential engineering and construction costs through

three different engineering firms. Mr. Murphy stated that this bridge had been qualified for this program through KDOT and it will provide up to \$120,000 of the construction costs. The Commissioners discussed that this is a very low traffic road and that it might be better to use these funds elsewhere. There was a discussion of the location of this bridge and that it was selected prior to Mr. Murphy's election and that it was selected from three sites that would qualify for this funding for low traffic bridges.
