Item One: Dr. James Triplett and Mr. Gene Vogler addressed the Commissioners in reference to the SEK Recycling Center, Inc. County Counselor Jim Emerson handed out information on income and expenses of the Recycling Center. Dr. Triplett spoke to the Commissioners. He stated that he is the Vice-Chairman of the Recycling Center and also the Chairman of the Solid Waste Planning Committee. He explained that he is here today to ask for financial assistance as they are having trouble making ends meet at the center. Mr. Gene Vogler, Treasurer of the Recycling Center addressed the Commissioners and discussed the income and expense document that was presented to the Commissioners. He said that the information on the sheet is for 2023. He went through and explained the income amounts relating to commodities and other income and the sources the income came from. He also went through and explained the expenses for the center. Mr. Vogler stated that in 2023 the center had a loss of approximately \$56,000. He said that the year of 2023 was started with a substantial balance and at the end of 2023 there was no money left. He explained that the first two months of 2024 has not been better and have already had a loss of approximately \$10,000. Commissioner Moody asked what the difference was in the 2 years and Mr. Vogler explained that commodities are the same price as 15 years ago and the center is not doing the volume like it was several years ago. Mr. Vogler explained other increases in expenses over the year including payroll and labor costs. He discussed the City of Pittsburg donating \$5,000 a month for the year 2024 if the County agrees to donate the same amount per month for 2024 which was discussed in a Commission meeting in December 2023. He stated that the Commissioners were not ready to make that commitment in December 2023. Dr. Triplett spoke about the relationship between Crawford County and the Recycling Center. He also discussed the large item drop off. He stated that he would like the Commissioners to reconsider the commitment the City of Pittsburg has offered and commit to donating \$5,000 a month to the center. He discussed a federal grant that Pittsburg State University received for economic development which will be used to design a circular economy system around plastics. Mr. Vogler spoke again and stated that the center has approximately \$8,000 in the bank and the payroll due next Tuesday is around \$8,000. Dr. Triplett stated that he will not ask the employees to work without pay and if they cannot pay the employees they will have to shut the center down. Commissioner Wood asked about some salvage

items that have been sitting in a dumpster at the center for quite a while asked why this material has not been moved, for revenue purposes and also to clean up the site. Mr. Vogler stated that issues with the trucking company, B-3 Construction, is the reasons the material has not been moved. Commissioner Wood would like to meet with the City of Pittsburg about the \$5,000 per month commitment. He said he is not in favor of giving the center \$5,000 a month for all of 2024 but is willing to help out this month. Mr. Vogler stated that someone needs to be recruited to join the facility that is knowledgeable about the recycling business and can help to get the center on its feet. Commissioner Wood asked about applying for grants and Mr. Vogel spoke about some grants that were received. Commissioner Wood asked Mr. Emerson to set up a meeting to discuss the Recycling Center with the City of Pittsburg. Commissioner Wood also stated that he will speak with B-3 Construction Co about picking up the salvage material at the facility. Dr. Triplett spoke about grant money in the amount of \$55,000 that the Recycling Center currently has in the bank.. He explained that the funds are for the purchase of a baler but this amount is only ½ of the cost of the baler. He explained that they will lose the \$55,000 grant money if they don't get another \$55,000 to match to purchase the baler by August. Dr. Triplett explained the costs of commodities and hoping the costs will go up.

On motion (24-142) of Commissioners Moody and the second of Commissioner Wood to approve giving the SEK Recycling Center Inc an amount of \$5,000 per month for a period of 2 months.

MESSAGES FROM APPOINTED OFFICIALS

Item One: Mr. Bill Towery, Environment Director addressed the Commissioners and asked that the Commissioners support the SEK Recycling Center in any way they can as he would hate to see what the county roads would look like without the availability of this facility. Commissioner Moody asked Mr. Towery about a tire day and Mr. Towery stated that Zoning Administrator May Smith is currently looking into this issue.

NEW BUSINESS

Item One: Mr. Emerson stated that work sessions for the Commissioners to sign bills and payroll vouchers need to be added to the agenda for mid-month and end of month.

Item Two: Mr. Emerson gave an update on the hearing in Topeka that Commissioner Wood and himself attended on Senate Bill #162. He said the hearing went well and there was testimony from a Riley County Commissioner, Riley County Counselor, Representative Ken Collins, and himself in support of the bill. Mr. Emerson explained that the committee has until March 22, 2024 to work the bill out of committee. He explained that remainder of the process for the bill to pass.

MESSAGES FROM THE PUBLIC

Item One: Mr. Greg Stiles from Scotwood Industries addressed the Commissioners. He stated that he would like to speak with the Commissioner about their choice for dust control for this season. Mr. Emerson explained that it was approved on Friday and the bid went to Home City Grain Inc. for dust control spraying at the price of \$1.45/gallon. Mr. Stiles asked the Commissioners if there were aware of the difference in the two companies products. Commissioner Wood stated that there were issues last year with Scotwood Industries and the timing of the spraying. Commissioner Wood said that the spraying was being done more that halfway through the season when the citizens had already paid in advance. Mr. Stiles stated that he knew there were issues last year and he has been in contact with Road & Bridge Coordinator Alyssa Edwards since the beginning of this year about getting the schedule set to be able to spray in late April and early May. Commissioner Wood explained that he has spoken with this road foreman and do not want dust control done until June and explained the reasons why. Mr. Stiles explained the issues with the delays last year. He spoke about Home City Grain and the effectiveness of their product and explained the difference in Home City Grain's product compared to Scotwood Industries' product. Commissioner Moody would like to revisit dust control when Commissioner Blair returns and will contact Mr. Stiles.
