OSAGE CHURCH OF THE BRETHREN (DUNKARD) CEMETERY

Located near N edge of the $SE^{\frac{1}{4}}$ of Sect. 25, Twp. 30 South, Rge. 22 East, back in east from the public road which intersects said quarter section N to S, on the W bank of Lightning Creek. It has a high location, is fenced, neatly attended, the general appearance is far better than most country cemeteries. Rows wide enough for one grave run from N to S; the cem. is rectangular, longer E to W. Two large evergreen trees are near center. A drive bisects cem. E-W near the S edge, there being room for only a few graves in each row S of the driveway. There are many old worn stones, but also many large granite ones of newer type.

This was copied Apr. 18, 1961, by Wm. and Jessie Cuthbertson. On Oct. 20, 1974, it was rechecked by Wm. Cuthbertson, and several later burials added.

The ashes of Mrs. Ethel Scott are buried by her mother, Ada Hammond Doty, no marker. Byron Ulery, son of Robert Clinton Ulery & g-son of Samuel H. and Mary A. Edgecomb Ulery, is buried here, but grave not marked.

Although this chametery is called the Osage Church of the Brethren cemetery, and is maintained by the church, it is not reserved for burial of church members only, as most Catholic and Lutheran cemeteries, but rather is used by the community.
