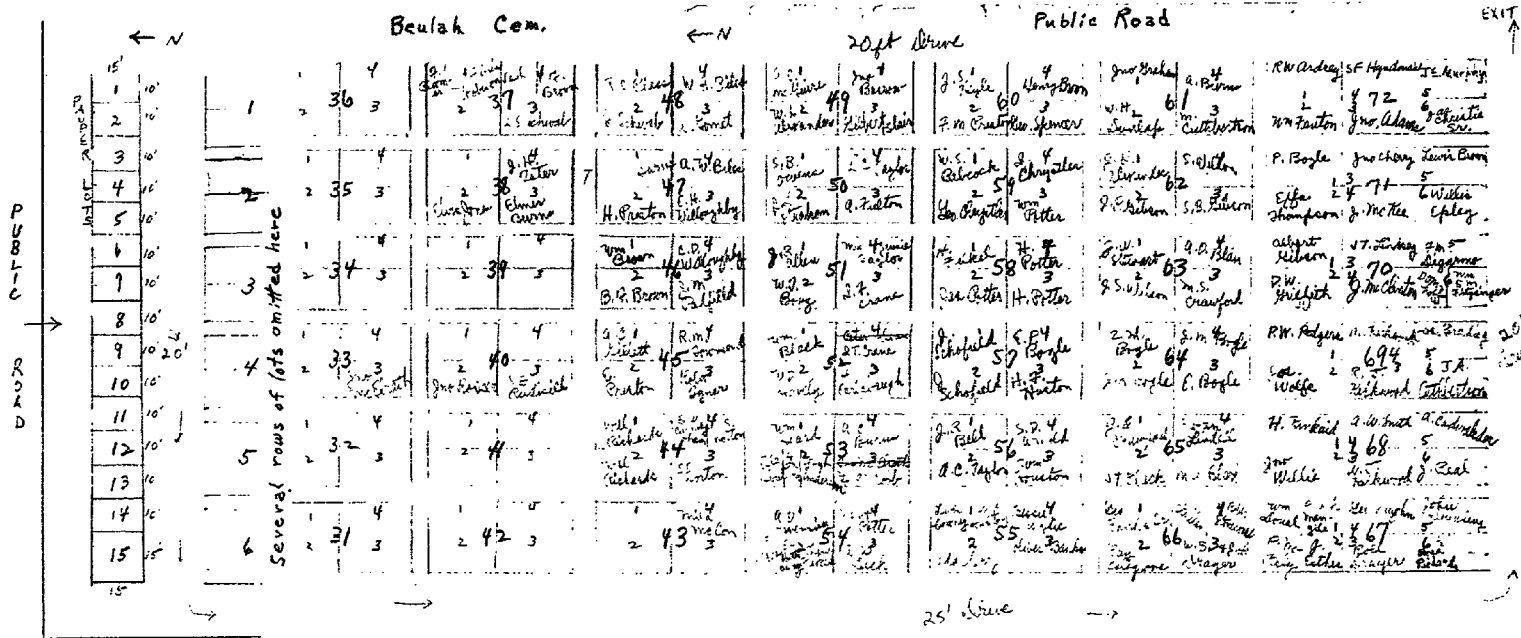
BEULAH CEMETERY

Copied by William and Jessie Cuthbertson, Girard, Kansas, 3-25-1961, etc.

The Beulah Cemetery is located one mile east of Beulah, Kansas, at the SW corner of the intersection, on the NE cor. of Sec. 18, Twp. 30 South, Range 24 East. An old county atlas shows 3.5 acres.

The Charter of the Beulah Cemetery Association, mentioned herein, states that the date of organization was Oct. 27, 1883. We noted several stones showing death dates preceding this date.

Mrs. George Banks (nee Ida Potter) of Girard, daughter of William Potter and wife Sarah Ellen (see p. 7 of Beulah burials) gave the explanation of how this came about. She stated that for several years before the Beulah Cemetery was established, burials were made on a farm a short distance away, across the public road intersection to the NE, diagonally opposite the present location. This was near the SW corner of Sec. 8, probably along the west fence or hedgerow. It is not known how early this site was used, how many burials were made, nor how many were later moved to the new cemetery. Mrs. Banks' brother, Henry A. Potter, who died 1880, was one of those whose body was removed to the new cemetery. (see p. 8)



The Beulah Cemetery Map was too long to show properly, and since there are no records of any lot sales from #1 to #32, we have omitted that part from this drawing. The Pauper lots are shown at the extreme N end. The road through the cemetery used at present crosses this row of pauper lots as it enters from the N. We added arrows to show the route of the present driveway. Most of the trees are gone.

"Charter of the Beulah Cemetery Association of Beulah Kansas" showed there were 7 directors and trustees for 1st year: Henry Brown, J. M. Padfield, John Cherry, James Schofield, A. C. McGuire, William Babcock and A. O. Blair all of Beulah Kans. Value of corporation: \$300. Dated 27th day Oct. 1883.

Robert L. Huston, residing 2 Mi. E and 1 1/2 mi S of cem. has the following records: (4-1-1961)

- (a) map, from which we sketched a copy 1/2 scale
- (b) book of receipt stubs for lots, which we did not copy (beginning 1898)
- (c) charter, notations from which are above
- (d) book showing names of purchasers of lots, copied on this and preceding pages.

According to his sister Miss Olga Huston the lots originally sold for \$6, now for \$10. They were planned to accommodate 6 burial spaces, but are actually about right for 5. There were no records of burials, only the names of those who purchased the lots.

Land records show that Henry T. Potter red'd. W.D. from M.R.F.S.&G. R.R. 11-4-1878, and deeded 3 1/2 a. off NE cor. to Beulah Cem. by W.D. 10-22-1884.
