## **Guide for Election Board School**

## **Instructions for Primary and General Elections**

- 1. Administer oath to board workers 25-2807 (See form EO)
- 2. Opening procedure
  - a. Time polls open when workers should be at the polls 25-2810(a), 25-106
  - b. Counting board time to arrive 25-2810(c)
  - c. Check supplies have a list of supplies available for checking 25-2706
  - d. List of persons who have voted advance voting ballots retained by supervising judges (not posted) 25-1126
- 3. Procedure if a member of board is not present 25-2805
- 4. Discuss duties of receiving board and counting board 25-2810 (b) (e)
  - a. If a 3-member board is used, make definite assignment of duties. These boards will have to double-up on duties 25-2810
  - b. Instructions to voter
    - 1. Time in booth instructions 25-2901 (voting machine counties 25-1333)
    - 2. Affidavit for change of address 25-2316c(b)
    - 3. Affidavit for change of name 25-2316c(a)
    - 4. Declaration of party affiliation if registration book (or party affiliation list) shows no party affiliation 25-3301(c)\*
  - c. Poll books clerks enter name of voter 25-2507
  - d. Party affiliation lists 25-3301(b)\*
  - e. Registration books mark voted 25-2908
  - f. Judge clips number and puts ballots in proper ballot box IN THE PRESENCE OF THE VOTER 25-2905
    - g. Number of ballots must correspond with the number in the poll book 25-2908
- 5. If the voter wishes to vote only in a special election held in conjunction with the primary, such voter does not need to declare party affiliation. List the names of such voters in a separate poll book.\*
- 6. Review procedure for challenging a voter 25-407 through 25-414; 25-2908
- 7. Explain duties of board in regard to the following:
  - a. Voters who are visually handicapped, physically disabled, or who lack proficiency in English and any voter 65 or more years of age may receive assistance from another person - 25-2909
  - b. Clerks must enter memorandum in poll books 25-2911
- $8. \ Replacement \ ballots Give \ sufficient \ instructions \ in \ regard \ to \ torn, defaced \ and \ wrongfully \ marked \ ballots 25-2902$

<sup>\*</sup>Applicable to primary election only

- 9. Meals Remind board workers to bring a sack lunch because there are no provisions for them to take time off or leave the polling places for meals.
- 10. Electioneering and soliciting of votes is prohibited within 250 feet of the polling place 25-2430. THIS ALSO APPLIES TO BOARD WORKERS.
- 11. Poll Agents check 25-3005 and 3005a for the definitions (during the original canvass 25-3004).
- 12. Be specific on the time polls are to open and close. At the time of the close of the polling place, only voters in line will be allowed to vote 25-2810(b).
- 13. Counting the votes 25-3001
  - a. A CHECK MARK IS LEGAL 25-614. Also, failure to make a cross or check mark in the space for a write-in does not invalidate the ballot 25-2903.
  - b. If polling place has only a receiving board, counting does not start until after the polls close.
    - c. Board of five or more members may be divided into receiving and counting boards 25-2810(b)
    - d. Counting board arrives at the time stated by the county election officer 25-2810(c)
  - e. Explain in detail the procedure for counting ballots (in the case of small boards, assign duties) 25-3001
    - f. Rules for canvassers are found in 25-3002
    - g. No result of the count shall be made known to any person not on the election board, except the county election officer or the deputies, until after the time to close the polls 25-2810(d)
- 14. Discuss preparation of abstract
  - a. Three abstracts 25-3006
  - b. All judges and clerks at the same voting place shall sign all three abstracts after the canvass is completed 25-2810(f), 25-2810(g) and 25-3006
- 15. Packaging of ballots and supplies for return to county election office 25-3007 and 25-3008.
- 16. All affidavits and declarations of party affiliation must be returned to the county election office with the election supplies 25-3007
- 17. Abstracts are not to be sealed with the ballots 25-3008(f). If a separate party affiliation list is provided, the list should be returned in the envelope containing the other election supplies.
- 18. Special boards to count all advance voting ballots 25-1133 and 25-1135
  - a. Follow procedures of canvass 25-3001 and 25-1135
  - b. Ballots received until the close of the polls 25-1132
  - c. Twenty-five ballots must remain in the ballot box until the closing of the polls 25-1135
- 19. Remind board workers serving in voting places other than their own that they may vote an advance voting ballot in accordance with 25-1119 or they shall be excused from their duties to vote at their respective voting place 25-2804 (d)
