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MESSAGES FROM OTHER GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES MESSAGES FROM ELECTED OFFICIALS PROCLAMATION AND ORDERS OF THE BOARD NEW BUSINESS

Item One: Mr. Wood discussed the KDOT Conference on September 6, 2017 in Topeka and discussed sending some of his crew to the conference.

UNDER THE HEADING OLD BUSINESS

Item One: Mr. Pyle handed out information on the sick pool. He stated that is a summary of the days used, days available and days donated to the pool over the last few years. He explained that there are 1,338 days available and there are 106 employees that are members. Mr. Emerson stated that he feels that donations should stop for a while as there are sufficient days in the pool at this time. He explained that an employee is required to have 10 sick days accrued to join the pool and the sick pool is part of the benefit package for new employees. Mr. Emerson answered the Commissioners that there are no limitations on the amount of days an employee can use from the sick pool but the committee has to approve the applications every 30 days. The Commissioner discussed asking Mr. Randy Chiartano and Mr. Joe Grisolano to serve on the sick pool committee. The Commissioners decided to discuss the sick pool further when there is a full committee in place.

Item Two: Mr. Pyle stated discussed the RHID unit with Ms. Becky Gray from the City of Pittsburg. He stated that he is getting the basic footwork done to set it up in a new taxing unit for the district. The Commissioners discussed the district and looked at maps of the proposed locations.

Item Three: Mr. Moody stated the that Joe Saia Overpass needs some work and that a part of the overpass belongs to the City of Pittsburg, part belongs to the City of Frontenac, part is in Mr. Moody's district and part is in Mr. Wood's district. The Commissioners will have Mr. Randy Chiartano look at the overpass.

Item Four: Mr. Murphy stated that the CVB would like to have a Commissioner assist with interviewing candidates for the position of CVB Director. Mr. Murphy volunteered to sit in on the interviews.

Item Five: The Commissioners discussed the Track Hoe Excavator and Mr. Moody stated that his lead man and foreman are excited about it and felt that the county could really utilize the equipment. All three Commissioners agreed to purchase the excavator and stated that the one the county currently owns is really rough and a new one is needed.

On motion (17-295) of Commissioner Moody and the second of Commissioner Wood to approve the purchase of a Caterpillar 313 F Hydraulic Excavator. Yeas: Commissioners Moody, Wood and Murphy Nays: Present but not voting: Absent or not voting: **The motion prevailed.**

Item Six: Mr. Wood discussed safety classes for the employees. He stated that he will contact Mr. Kenny Yoakam from EMS and have him get with Ms. Charli Stroud to set up CPR classes. The Commissioners stated that they would like the Road and Bridge employees to attend classes around the end of October after most of the road work is completed. The Commissioner discussed having 2 or 3 different sessions and to hold the classes at the EMS building.

Item Seven: Mr. Wood stated that he spoke to Ms. May Smith about Sewer District #4 and bills on grinder pumps. He stated that Ms. Smith is checking into getting the details of the bill. Mr. Murphy stated he researched the finances of SD#4 from the start of the district and will get a copy of his findings to the other Commissioners. Mr. Emerson explained how the financing took place when the sewer was installed. Mr. Moody stated that he would like a better explanation on what repairs are begin done and whether is it replacing or repairing the pumps. The Commissioners would like to schedule a work session on August 25, 2017 with Coby Hinton at 9:00 AM.

Item Eight: The Commissioners had a brief discussion on the new buildings.
