Commissioners Tom Moody and Jeff Murphy were in attendance.

County Clerk Don Pyle was seated with the Board.

Chairman Wood led the pledge of allegiance.

NEW BUSINESS

Item One: County Clerk Don Pyle addressed the Employee Policy Manual. He stated he contacted Pittsburg State University for a quote of having the manuals printed and bound. The college gave a price of \$675.00 for 300 manuals. Mr. Pyle explained that 300 manuals will be enough for every county employee to have a copy and a small supply for new employees when hired. Mr. Wood asked about adding extra pages if there should be changes to the policy. There was a discussion on different ways to compile the policies. The Commissioners approved having Pittsburg State University print and bind the manuals. Mr. Murphy stated that he would like the manual posted to the County Website.

Mr. Wood addressed running a driver's license report on new employees. The Commissioners discussed this issue and what charges would be involved. Mr. Pyle will check with Sheriff Peak on running the reports.

Item Two: Commissioner Murphy and District #1 Road Foreman Billy Kavanagh spoke about a box culvert at the intersection of 690th and 90th Streets east of Walnut. Mr. Murphy stated that the culvert is not wide enough for the farmers to get their machinery over. He explained that it is 12 feet wide at this time and would like to add 6 more feet in width. He discussed getting a quote from Mr. Steve Bright to do the work for a price of \$14,133. Mr. Murphy stated that this should be the total cost and there should be no additional costs. Mr. Moody stated that he feels that this is a project is worth looking into. Mr. Kavanagh discussed the traffic on this road. Mr. Murphy stated that after discussion he would rather widen the culvert to 20'. Mr. Murphy will talk to the engineer and keep the Commissioners updated on this issue.

Item Three: Mr. Murphy discussed purchasing a grapple bucket to clean out bridges for FEMA. Mr. Wood stated that he has looked at one and believes the cost would be around

\$2,200. The Commissioners approved Mr. Murphy and Mr. Kavanagh to move forward with getting a price for the grapple bucket.

Item Four: Mr. Wood stated that everything is settled with the insurance company on the road and bridge buildings.

UNDER THE HEADING OLD BUSINESS

Item One: County Clerk Don Pyle presenting the July 2017 Clerk's Report. Mr. Pyle stated that this report summarizes the total amounts spent by departments for payroll and bills during the month of July. Mr. Pyle also gave the Commissioners a copy of the June 2017 to July 2017 Clerk's Report of Changes in Expenditures for comparison. Mr. Pyle reviewed the changes with the Commissioners and discussed some of the reasons for the changes. There was a lengthy discussion on the charges for Sewer District #4 for grinder pumps. Mr. Coby Hinton and Ms. May Smith spoke to the Commissioner and explained the charges for that district. The Commissioners discussed the bills for Sewer District # 4 and asked that Mr. Hinton get a copy of all bills when received. The Commissioners talked about the company that is currently repairing the replacing the grinder pumps. The Commissioners asked Ms. Smith and Mr. Hinton to gather some additional information on Sewer District # 4 and return on Friday.
