**Item One:** Mr. Edward Fields, Noxious Weed Director spoke to the Commissioners about the grinder. He stated that it is in need of repairs and he has a quote from Fairbank Equipment, Wichita, KS in the amount of \$1092.00. Mr. Fields explained that this is a quote and the representative from Fairbank stated that this quote is on the high side and it might not cost the entire amount. Mr. Fields stated that the grinder will be needed right after the first of the year for brush control on intersections and Fairbank Equipment can have it repaired by December 20, 2017. There was a discussion on having it repaired in the county shop and Mr. Fields stated that is should be repaired by someone that works on this type of machinery. Mr. Moody and Mr. Murphy stated they are fine with taking it to Wichita to be fixed. Mr. Wood was concerned with the need for the repairs and that the grinder has not been used on County property for quite a few years. He stated that it is loaned out and does not get returned. The Commissioners would like an operator from the County sent with the machine if it is loaned out. The Commissioners would like Mr. Fields to be in charge of the grinder. The Commissioner gave Mr. Fields permission to have the grinder fixed through Fairbank Equipment.

RESOLUTION NO. 2017-031

A RESOLUTION APPOINTING THE COUNTY APPRAISER FOR CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS.

WHEREAS, K.S.A. § 19-430 requires the Board of County Commissioners of each county in the State of Kansas to appoint a County Appraiser every four (4) years to fulfill the statutory duties and responsibilities of that office, and K.S.A. § 19-434 requires the Board of County Commissioners to fix the compensation for such County Appraiser by resolution;

WHEREAS, the term of such appointment is for a period of four (4) years and until a successor is appointed, unless the County Appraiser is removed from office pursuant to statute or otherwise terminated by the Board of County Commissioners;

WHEREAS, the State of Kansas Property Valuation Division has been acting as the Crawford County Appraiser;

WHEREAS, Zach Edwards is a Certified Kansas Appraiser, according to the requirements of the Property Valuation Division of the Kansas Department of Revenue, and is otherwise qualified to hold the position of County Appraiser; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Crawford County, Kansas deems it to be in the best interests of the County and its residents to appoint Zach Edwards as County Appraiser for a term beginning on December 5, 2017 and ending June 30, 2021, subject to removal from office pursuant to statute or termination by the Board of County Commissioners.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Crawford County, Kansas as follows:

Section 1. Appointment of County Appraiser. Zach Edwards is hereby appointed as the County Appraiser for Crawford County, Kansas for a term beginning December 5, 2017 and ending June 30, 2021, unless his appointment is terminated pursuant to statute or by action of the Board of County Commissioners prior to the expiration of such term.

Section 2. Compensation of County Appraiser. The County Appraiser appointed hereunder shall be paid as

compensation for his services an initial annual salary of \$85,000.00. The County Appraiser's work week is hereby set at 40 hours.

**Item Three:** Mr. Emerson presented an agreement between Crawford County, Kansas and First Call of Kansas, Inc. for transportation of bodies for medical examinations authorized by the County Coroner. Mr. Emerson stated that the cost did increase slightly but is still a very competitive and reasonable rate. He stated that he spoke to the County Coroner and Dr. Paoni stated that First Call has been providing a great service.

#### AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and executed this \_\_\_\_\_ day of <u>feature</u> between <u>Crawford</u> County, Kansas, hereinafter referred to as "County", and First Call of Kansas, Inc., hereinafter referred to as "Contractor", collectively referred to as the "Parties", witnesseth:

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, County recently advertised for bids to transport bodies for medical examinations authority by the Coroner (the "Coroner"); and

WHEREAS, Contractor submitted a bid proposal dated December, 2017, which met the bid specifications.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the matters described above and of the mutual benefits and obligations set forth in this Agreement, the Parties agree as follows:

# ARTICLE I - RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

The Parties intend that an independent contractor relationship will be created by this Agreement. County is interested only in the results to be achieved, and the conduct and control of the work will lie solely with Contractor. Contractor is not to be considered an agent or employee of County for any purpose, and the employees of Contractor are not to be entitled to any of the benefits that County provides for County's employees.

### ARTICLE II - DESCRIPTION OF WORK

The work to be performed by Contractor includes transportation of bodies for medical examinations authorized by the  $\underline{Couver} \underline{LOROVEL}$ . The Contractor will supply all vehicles, equipment and personnel necessary for the performance of the work. All work must be authorized by the Coroner in order to be eligible for payment.

### ARTICLE III - DUTIES OF CONTRACTOR

Contractor shall, during the period of this Agreement:

1. Observe and conform to all the laws relating to the transportation of bodies; and

2. Render to County a true account of all work performed by Contractor on behalf of County.

#### ARTICLE IV - PAYMENT

County will pay Contractor the sum of  $\frac{2150}{20}$  per one-way trip or  $\frac{430}{20}$  per round trip for the work to be performed under this Agreement.

# ARTICLE V - BEST EFFORTS

Contractor shall, at all times during the term of this Agreement, faithfully, industrially, and to the best of its ability, experience and talents, perform all the duties that may be required of and from it pursuant to the express and implicit terms of this Agreement, to the reasonable satisfaction of County.

# ARTICLE VI - TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of this Agreement shall commence effective () (center 1, 2017 and terminate ) (center 1, 2020) thereafter, this Agreement shall automatically renew for periods of one year, under the same terms and conditions contained herein, unless either party notifies the other at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration of the original term or extensions thereof, and provided, further, that either party may cancel this Agreement, during any extended term, upon ninety (90) days' written notice to the other party.

### ARTICLE VII - LIABILITY

The work to be performed under this Agreement will be performed at Contractor's risk. Contractor agrees to indemnify County for any and all liability or loss arising on account of Contractor's own negligence in the performance of this Agreement. Contractor shall maintain liability insurance in the sum of not less than \$100,000 at all times during the initial and extended term of this Agreement, and County shall be named as an additional insured on said insurance policy, which shall not be cancelable by the insurance company until and unless the County is notified at least ten (10) days prior to the expiration date.

### ARTICLE VIII - CONTENT

This Agreement contains the entire Agreement concerning the arrangement between the Parties and shall, as of the effective date hereof, supersede all other Agreements between the Parties.

# ARTICLE IX - MODIFICATION OF AGREEMENT

Any modification of this Agreement or additional obligation assumed by either Party in connection with this Agreement shall be binding only if evidenced in writing and signed by each Party.
