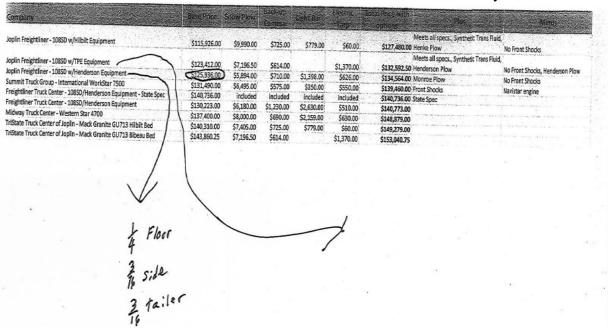

# MESSAGES FROM THE PUBLIC PROCLAMATION AND ORDERS OF THE BOARD NEW BUSINESS

Item One: Mr. Pyle showed the Commissioners an email from Jason VanBecelaere about the purchase price of new 911 towers. There was a discussion about increasing the insurance coverage of the towers and taking the cost for the premiums out of the 911 fund. Mr. Wood asked about the response from the other entities that are going to be billed for the building insurance premiums that are currently being paid by the county. Mr. Pyle stated that he has identified the buildings and what entities they belong to but has not yet sent out bills for the premiums. Mr. Wood was answered that the 2005/2006 vehicles were kept at full coverage and the work comp limit was increased to \$1,000,000. Mr. Pyle stated that a bill will be received for the increase in the work comp limit and the increase in the tower coverage.

**Item Two:** Mr. Murphy asked about the status of researching the video system for the Commission Room. Mr. Pyle stated that Mr. Jim Vinze, IT Manager has researched it and Mr. Pyle will contact him and have him come to the next meeting. Mr. Murphy discussed

the issue of the Commissioners having a Facebook page and it was decided not to move forward with this project.

Item Three: Commissioner Moody discussed the Agreement with James River Mechanical & Electrical Service for the Chilled Water Pump Placement at the District Court Building in Pittsburg.

#### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

By accepting this proposal, Purchaser agrees to be bound by the following terms and conditions: Owner shall be identified as "Purchaser" under these terms and contractor shall be identified as "contractor".

- 1.SCOPE OF WORK. This proposal is based upon the use of straight time labor only. Purchaser shall not back charge contractor for any costs or expenses without contractor's written consent.
- 2.INVOICING & PAYMENTS. Terms are Net 30. Invoices not paid within 30 days of date of invoice are delinquent. A 2% per month fee will be added for delinquent payments.
- 3.MATERIALS. If the materials or equipment included in this proposal become temporarily or permanently unavailable for reasons beyond the control and without the fault of JRMES, then in the case of permanent unavailability, the time for performance of the work shall be extended to the extent thereof, and in the case of permanent unavailability, JRMES shall (a) be excused from furnishing said materials or equipment, and (b) be reimbursed for the difference between the cost of the materials or equipment permanently unavailable and the cost of a reasonably available substitute therefor,
- 4. WARRANTY. Contractor warrants products installed by under this contract and workmanship for a period of one year unless specified elsewhere.
- 5.LIABILITY. Contractor shall not be liable for any special, indirect or consequential damages arising in any manner from the equipment or material furnished or the work performed pursuant to this agreement.
- 6.TAXES. The price of this proposal does not include duties, sales, use, excise, or other similar taxes, unless required by federal, state or local law. Purchaser shall pay, in addition to the stated price; all taxes not legally required to be paid by Contractor or, alternatively, shall provide Contractor with acceptable tax exemption certificates.
- 7.DELAYS. Contractor shall not be liable for any delay in the performance of the work resulting from or attributed to acts or circumstances beyond Contractor's control, including, but not limited to, acts of God, fire, riots, labor disputes, conditions of the premises, acts or omissions of the Purchaser, Owner, or other Contractors or delays caused by suppliers or subcontractors of this contractor etc.
- 8.COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS. Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations and shall obtain all temporary licenses and permits required for the prosecution of the work. Licenses and permits of a permanent nature shall be procured and paid for by the Purchaser.
- ATTORNEYS' FEES. Purchaser agrees that he will pay and reimburse Contractor for any and all reasonable attorneys' fees which are incurred by the contractor in the collection of amounts due and payable hereunder.
- INSURANCE. Insurance coverage in excess of Contractor's standard limits will be furnished when requested and required. No credit will be given or premium paid by Contractor for insurance afforded by others.
- 11. INDEMNITY. The Parties hereto agree to indemnify each other from any and all liabilities, claims, expenses, losses or damages, including attorneys' fees, which may arise in connection with the execution of the work herein specified and which are caused, in whole or in part, by the negligent act or omission of the Indemnifying Party.
- 12. OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH. The Parties hereto agree to notify each other immediately upon becoming aware of an inspection under, or any alleged violation of, the Occupational Safety and Health Act relating in any way to the project or project site.
- ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This proposal, upon acceptance, shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior representations or understandings.
- CHANGES. No change or modification of any of the terms and conditions stated herein shall be binding upon Contractor unless accepted by Contractor in writing.

**Item Four:** Commissioner Wood stated that the Safety Meeting is at 8 in the morning at the Homer Cole Center and will last approximately 2 hours. Mr. Wood would like a sign in sheet at the meeting and to have the sign in sheet kept on file for insurance purposes. Mr. Wood reported on some work comp claim statistics. He also discussed safety sessions for all county employees. The Commissioners discussed different types of safety meetings that could be held. Mr. Wood will check with EMC to see what training sessions they have available.

**Item Five:** Mr. Wood addressed the County/City Luncheon scheduled for March 9. He stated that Crawford County and the City of Pittsburg will co-host at the Pittsburg Fire Station #1 and Mr. Daron Hall will take care of the agenda. The Commissioners discussed topics to go over at the meeting. Mr. Pyle has sent out information to all city clerks.

**Item Six:** Mr. Pyle stated that SEK Quarterly Meeting is March 16, 2017 in Oswego and the deadline to respond is March 1, 2017.

### UNDER THE HEADING OLD BUSINESS

**Item One:** Mr. Pyle addressed break down of health insurance claims. Mr. Pyle showed a breakdown of the claims with the 2016/2017 claims divided and also Mental Health claims for 2016 broken out and retiree claims. He stated that most claims were county employees. He explained that the 2016 claims should be close to being finished. Mr. Pyle explained retiree coverages and claims. Mr. Murphy suggested contacting the retirees and let them know they might be able to get coverage elsewhere cheaper and with better coverage than they are getting at the county.

**Item Two:** Mr. Murphy addressed the fence at the shop. He stated that Mr. Peak was to get quotes. Mr. Murphy will contact Mr. Peak and check on the status of that project.

**Item Three:** Mr. Murphy showed some plans he has drawn up for sewer lines and lagoons at the fairgrounds and stated that the fair board and Mr. Towery have approved this. The Commissioners discussed the County's assistance in the cost of this system. Mr. Moody addressed the issue of the City of Girard helping with the cost of the sewer system. Mr. Murphy suggested having a meeting with the Fair Board, the Commissioners and the City of Girard and the other Commissioners agreed.

**Item Four:** Mr. Murphy discussed a few of the funds that are over budget.
