UNDER THE HEADING NEW BUSINESS

MESSAGES FROM THE PUBLIC:

Item One: Mr. Mike Williams, Senior Energy Executive, Pro Energy Solutions addressed the Commissioners. He stated that Pro Energy Solutions is a natural gas provider that will bill the county separately for the use of gas. He presented information on his company to the Commissioners and went through the documentation with the Commissioners. Mr. Williams explained the cost comparisons with Kansas Gas Service Company and Pro Energy Solutions. He stated if they purchase natural gas from Pro Energy Solutions a bill will still be received from Kansas Gas Service for meter reading and transportation charges. He informed the Commissioners of local businesses and public entities that his company contracts with. Commissioner Johnson was answered that purchasing natural gas from his company is allowed by state statute. Mr. Williams stated that his company offers a 12 month contact with auto renew and 60 day opt out and that this contract can be modified. Chairman Moody requested that County Clerk Don Pyle obtain a list of the contracts currently held in our area with Pro Energy Solutions and speak with a few of the businesses and public entities and County Counselor Jim Emerson review the contract that Mr. Williams provided him.



MESSAGES FROM OTHER GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES MESSAGES FROM ELECTED OFFICIALS MESSAGES FROM APPOINTED OFFICIALS

Item One: Mr. Ed Fields, Noxious Weed Director addressed the Commissioners. Mr. Fields introduced himself to the new Commissioners and stated that he is the Crawford County Noxious Weed Director and that he is also the Treasurer of the Southeast Kansas Weed Directors and President of the SEK Weed Managers. Mr. Fields discussed the noxious weed law. He stated that in Kansas it is required to maintain or prevent 14 different varieties of noxious weeds but only 5 types of these weeds are in Crawford

County. He explained the duties of his department and discussed the equipment rental program and the sale of chemicals to save the taxpayers money. Mr. Fields stated that he works with all the incorporated cities and the unincorporated areas in Crawford County to maintain control of the noxious weeds. Mr. Moody stated that Mr. Fields has made his department into one of the top Noxious Weed departments in the State of Kansas.

NOXIOUS WEED CONTROL ON COUNTY LAND

Johnson Grass

Johnson grass on County Right-of-Way and other County Lands will be treated as follows:

- a. The County Roadside will be patrolled on a continuous day-to-day basis
- b. All Johnson Grass found will be treated by one of three methods:
 - Johnson grass found in a good stand of Fescue will be treated with Out Rider or a compatible chemical at label rate.
 - 2. Johnson grass found in a situation other than a good stand of grass will be treated with glyphosate.
 - 3. UTV will be used as extra unit to treat Johnson grass on all right of ways.
 - 4. All paved residence roads will use Out Rider or selective chemical only.

Field Bindweed

- 1. The County Roadside will be patrolled on a daily basis and the Bindweed infestation will be recorded and treated as soon as possible.
- Field Bindweed will be treated on a periodic and timely manner with an adequate chemical, not usually carried on the spray truck

Musk Thistle

All County Roadsides will be patrolled early in the growing season to locate any infestation of Musk Thistle

Any Musk Thistle found will be recorded and treated as soon as possible

Bull Thistle

All County Roadsides will be patrolled early in the growing season to locate any infestation of Bull Thistle

Any Bull Thistle found will be sprayed according to label rate

Sericea Lespedeza

 All County Roadsides and County owned land will be patrolled and mapped to locate any infestation and treatment will be handled in a timely manor.

Invasive species (Japanese/Bohemian; knotweed)

18 separate locations were treated in 2018, locations were recorded and transferred to Kansas Department of agriculture. We have for the past six years treated these 18 locations, throughout the last six years we have successfully controlled these locations but not totally eliminated the species. The major threat has been contained but new locations have been found and have been added to the treatment schedule.

Note:

While patrolling the roadside for the above five noxious weeds an eye will be kept open for any other noxious weeds and invasive species. If any are found, they will be taken care of if budget is there to do so.

NOXIOUS WEEDS ON STATE RIGHT-OF-WAY AND OTHER STATE LAND

A. Johnson Grass on State Right-of-Way

- We were not offered the contract for noxious weed control on the state highway for this current year.
 - The contract was given to a commercial firm.
- 2. We will monitor their performance and make sure all noxious weeds are controlled
- B. All other noxious weeds on state highway lands will be treated as set out in Item "A" above

The only other state land in Crawford County is located at Farlington Lake and Crawford State Park No.1 along with two mine land areas.

These properties are patrolled periodically for noxious weeds and the findings are reported to the area manager.

There is a small infestation of Kudzu at the fish hatchery located at Farlington lake. This infestation is old and is being monitored. There does not seem to be any seed production and the size of the patch is controlled by water and mowing on three sides.

NOXIOUS WEED CONTROL ON PRIVATE LAND

A. Johnson Grass

- 1. Johnson Grass on private land will be surveyed during the daily patrol of the county roadside
- All infestations of Johnson grass on private land will be monitored to see if there is any effort being made toward control. Johnson Grass in

Crawford County has two classifications:

- a. In or near crop land: This is our primary concern....the land owner is personally contacted as soon as it is evident that the problem is being neglected. This approach has worked well.
- b. Non-Crop land: This is classified as pasture or marginal land. Johnson grass in these areas are treated with less concern that those in crop lands. The land owner is contacted and direction is given for control.
 Chemical control for Johnson grass will be as recommended
 - Chemical control for Johnson grass will be as recommended by State Board of Agriculture.
 - 3. Chemicals will be cost shared to the land owner 75% plus handling fee.
- a. Chemicals are not sold on a demand basis. An actual infestation of Johnson grass needs to be seen or have previous knowledge by the Weed Director before the chemical is sold.
 - At this point only enough product will be sold for the particular situation.
- b. Roundup is not cost shared until after the first of June each year. This is to discourage usage for other than noxious weed control.
- c. Fusion, Plateau and Out Rider is the only other chemical costs shared by the county for Johnson Grass found in crops or infested areas.

B. Bindweed

- 1. Field Bindweed is treated in the same manner as all other noxious weeds. Infestations are checked during the regular patrolling of the county road system
 - a. 24D is the chemical cost shared for Bindweed at a rate of 75% plus handling fee

C. Musk Thistle

1. So far in Crawford County, Musk Thistle has been controlled by the use of Milestone, 24D and Escort hand digging with the land owner's cooperation and help Milestone, 24D are used when plant is in bolt, spring treatment requires ½ ounce of Escort and fall treatment requires 24D

D. Canada Thistle

1. There is only two known Canada Thistle patch in Crawford County and it was sprayed with Milestone and 24D in the late spring of 2017 There were a few plants treated in 2018. This particular patch will continue to be monitored. The second area was treated with Milestone at a rate of 6oz for the last 3 years.

E. Bull Thistle

1. Bull Thistle being in its sixth year we are making progress, reoccurrence of bull Thistle is reoccurrence is much less than musk. We continue our efforts in containing this problem.

NON-NOXIOUS WEEDS

- A. Non-Noxious weeds and brush are treated differently each year which is dependent upon the budget
 - During most of the past years, spraying around most bridge guard rails when the chemical is available for such weed control
 - 2. There are several miles of new guard rails along strip mine pits and these are sprayed on an as-needed. The chemical most commonly used is Sahara
 - 3. The Crawford County Weed Department also does some winter-time basal bark spraying with Garlon 4, Accest, and diesel fuel. This also is dependent upon the budget
 - 4. Also the ongoing control of Japanese Knot Weed is part of every year spraying.
 - 5. As of 2012 the County Commissioners ask to advise them on a right of way maintenance plan. My dept wrote and conveyed said plain to road and bridge employees.
 - We carried on with the program with a Highway Road and Bridge Department holding another meeting to educate and evaluate right away control.
 - We tested a new method on brush and tree control using (Kernite) for controlling trees overhanging roads.

CITY LANDS

A. Noxious weeds in the two larger cities (Pittsburg and Girard) are maintained by the city or by private land owners.

Once a year the county will make a survey of these two cities and any noxious weeds that are not being controlled will be referred to the land owner.

B. The other remaining towns (incorporated and unincorporated) will be surveyed annually and in most cases the noxious weeds will be treated by the County. These small towns neither have the finances or the equipment to control such noxious weeds.

SURVEY

A. The survey will be conducted as recommended by the State Board of Agriculture. A new mapping system is currently being developed to better define the infestations on private land. This process is aided by the use of maps made available through the Zoning Office, the G.I.S. Department, and the S.C.S.

OUTREACH

- A. The Crawford County Weed Department is currently involved with monthly Radio spots with KKOW
 - **B.** Test plots in conjunction with K-State, Pittsburg State University, Dow, and Bayer for Sericea Lespedeza, Johnson Grass and Knotweed.
 - C. Informational presentations to schools and organizations
 - D. Past and current President of Southeast Kansas Weed Management Area.
 - E. Past President of Southeast Kansas Weed Directors.
 - F. Working with Bayer as an advisory on new Chemicals

RESOLUTION # 2019 - 00 (AND PROCLAMATION

PROCLAMATION of a State of Local Disaster Emergency for CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS

WHEREAS on the7th day of February 2019, the Board of Commissioners of CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS finds that certain conditions have caused, or eminently threated to cause wide-spread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property in disaster proportion in CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS;

WHEREAS, such conditions have created obstruction which endanger health, safety and welfare of persons and proper with the border of CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS:

That the Board of County Commissioners of CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS under and be virtue of the authority vested in it by K.S.A.1976 Supp. 48-932, does hereby PROCLAIM that a State of Local Disaster Emergency exists.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND PROCLAIMED that the area within the border of CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS covered by this proclamation / resolution is the entire area of CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said Board has all rights and/or powers to perform such functions as are vested in said Board by and through the provisions of the Kansas Emergency Preparedness Act of 1975.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND PROCLAIMED that this resolution shall remain in effect for a period of seven (7) days unless terminated earlier or renewed by consent of the governing body.






PROCLAMATION AND ORDERS OF THE BOARD NEW BUSINESS
