The Crawford County Board of Commissioners met pursuant to Kansas Statutes.

Annotated Chapter 19, Article 2, Section 18 in due and regular session with open doors.

Commissioner Carl Wood served as the presiding officer.

Commissioners Tom Moody and Jeff Murphy were in attendance.

County Clerk Don Pyle and County Counselor Jim Emerson were seated with the Board.

Chairman Wood led the pledge of allegiance.

UNDER THE HEADING NEW BUSINESS PUBLIC HEARINGS AND OPENING OF ANNOUNCED BIDS MESSAGES FROM THE COUNTY LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH MESSAGES FROM THE PUBLIC

Item One: Mr. Will Holt, Crawford County Fire District #4 Fire Chief introduced himself and stated that Mr. Joey Adams stepped down and he took his place and Mr. Joseph Clow, Fire Chief for the City of Girard introduced himself and they stated that they are going to work cooperatively. Mr. Wood stated that he would like to see the smaller fire departments in the smaller cities come under the fire districts but not take their equipment away just work together to have more man power and equipment to help out. Mr. Moody stated that volunteers are getting harder to find and Mr. Holt stated that this is an issue nationwide as he has been looking into that and it is a struggle right now and that if the Girard and District 4 departments come together it will be helpful. Mr. Holt stated that the smaller fire departments have been approached in the past about combining with District 4 but he has not contacted any of them recently. There was a discussion on combining small fire departments with the district and the advantages it would create. The Commissioners stated that they are willing to help if any is needed. Mr. Mark McAtee from Fire District #4 introduced himself and discussed some information that the county could provide that would be helpful when contacting the taxpayers and letting them know the benefits of joining with District #4. Mr. McAtee stated that the joining together would help with budget, equipment and personnel.

MESSAGES FROM APPOINTED OFFICIALS

Item One: Mr. Troy Graham, Zoning Administrator addressed the updated Nuisance Regulations. There was a discussion of inoperable vehicles that are considered a nuisance. He also presented Resolution #2018-001, A Resolution Concerning the Adoption by Reference of the January 2018 Nuisance and Dangerous Structure Abatement Regulations for Certain Lands within the Unincorporated Portion of Crawford County, Kansas, Except Those Lands within the Incorporated Cities. The Commissioners and Mr. Graham discussed the Resolution. Mr. Graham stated that the Resolution will be published in the paper and posted to the website. Mr. Graham stated that he will present Codes Court regulations next week and Mr. Emerson stated that the advertisement for the Codes Court Judge will be sent to the Bar Association.

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-001

A RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE ADOPTION BY REFERENCE OF THE JANUARY 2018 NUISANCE AND DANGEROUS STRUCTURE ABATEMENT REGULATIONS FOR CERTAIN LANDS WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED PORTION OF CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS, EXCEPT THOSE LANDS WITHIN THE INCORPORATED CITIES.

WHEREAS, the Crawford County Zoning Administrator has prepared the proposed January 2018 Nuisance and Dangerous Structure Abatement Regulations for certain lands within the unincorporated portion of Crawford County, Kansas, except those lands within any incorporated cities; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to K.S.A. 19-101 et seq. the Board of County Commissioners are authorized to adopt regulations to govern the health, safety and general welfare of residents in Crawford County, Kansas; and

WHEREAS, in order to regulate conditions that can lead to adverse health and safety conditions, the Board of County Commissioners finds it is in the best interests of the County to establish a policy regarding nuisances and dangerous buildings or structures in the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS, that:

- The proposed Nuisance and Dangerous Structure Abatement Regulations for certain lands within the unincorporated portion of Crawford County, Kansas, except those lands within any incorporated cities, are hereby adopted pursuant to K.S.A. 19-101 through 19-101f.
- 2. The said Nuisance and Dangerous Structure Abatement Regulations for all of Crawford County, Kansas, except those lands within the incorporated cities were prepared in book form by the Crawford County Zoning Administrator under the date of January, 2018, and the same is hereby declared to be approved and incorporated herein by reference as fully as if set out herein pursuant to K.S.A. 12-3301, as amended, and K.S.A. 12-3303 through 12-3305.
- 3. Not less than three (3) copies of the Nuisance and Dangerous Structure Abatement Regulations shall be filed with the County Clerk marked "Official Copy as Incorporated by Resolution Number 2018-001" and to which there shall be attached a published copy of this Resolution, said copies to be open for inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours.
- 4. Any person or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of these Regulations or fail to comply herewith, or with any of the requirements thereof shall cause the Public Official, through the Crawford County Counselor, to file a complaint in the Codes Court of Crawford County, Kansas, against such alleged violator and, upon conviction of any violation of these Regulations, such person shall be fined in an amount not to exceed the approved Codes Court Schedule and to

include court costs. Each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues, after notice has been served, shall constitute a separate offense. In certain cases Crawford County may use abatement procedures with costs billed to the responsible party.

- 5. Any provision of this Resolution which shall be declared invalid shall not affect the validity and authority of any other sections.
- 6. The previous Nuisance and Dangerous Structure Abatement Regulations and any previous resolutions or any parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed.
- 7. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after it publication once in the official county newspaper.

Item Three: Commissioner Jeff Murphy presented an agreement between Cook, Flatt & Strobel, Engineers, PA and Crawford County for design surveys and preparation of plans, and cost estimates for the replacement of County Bridge No. 205 located on 580th Street between 20th & 30th Streets in the amount of \$38,000. Mr. Murphy stated that the replacement of this bridge is being paid on an 80/20 match by KDOT. The Commissioners discussed the need for the replacement of this bridge.

AGREEMENT

between

COOK, FLATT & STROBEL

ENGINEERS, P.A.

and

CRAWFORD COUNTY, STATE OF KANSAS

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between the Board of COUNTY Commissioners of CRAWFORD COUNTY, State of Kansas, hereinafter referred to as the COUNTY; and the firm of COOK, FLATT & STROBEL, ENGINEERS, P.A., 2930 SW Woodside Drive, Topeka, Kansas 66614, hereinafter referred to as the ENGINEER.

WITNESSETH:

That the said COUNTY desires the services of the ENGINEER for design surveys and preparation of plans, and cost estimates for the replacement of County Bridge No. 205 located on 580th Street between 20th & 30th.

The extent and scope of engineering services include design surveys and plan preparation for bridge and roadwork in accordance with approved practices and requirements of the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT).

For the engineering services the ENGINEER shall receive a lump sum fee of Thirty Eight Thousand Dollars (\$38,000.00) for Bridge No. 205.

It is further agreed that payment shall be made by the COUNTY on the basis of progress of the work; that sixty percent (60%) of said fee shall be considered as due upon furnishing of field check plans and one hundred percent (100%) of said fee, less previous payments, shall be considered as due when final plans are completed and submitted to the COUNTY in full compliance with County plan submittal scheduling. In addition, the COUNTY shall be obligated to pay for services under this Agreement as may lawfully be made from (a) funds budgeted and appropriated for that purpose during the COUNTY'S current budget year or (b) funds made available from any lawfully operated revenue producing source.

SECTION I

THE ENGINEER AGREES

Paragraph One

The ENGINEER agrees to make the necessary design surveys and prepare plans, specifications, right-of-way and easement descriptions, and estimates for the improvement hereinbefore mentioned, for the fee as stipulated, which fee shall be complete and sufficient payment for all work performed, equipment or materials used, and services rendered in connection with such work. It is understood that such work shall be completed according to approved standard practices and rules or regulations of the Kansas Department of Transportation.

Paragraph Two

The ENGINEER further agrees to accept compensation for such work from said COUNTY in such amounts and at such periods as have been by said ENGINEER and said COUNTY mutually agreed.

Paragraph Three

The ENGINEER further agrees:

1. To comply with all Federal, State, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the work.

2. To procure all licenses or permits necessary for his business operation under said agreement. Special project permits required by the Division of Water Resources, the Corps of Engineers, or other governmental agencies shall be obtained by the COUNTY with assistance and cooperation of the ENGINEER. Any fees required by governmental agencies to obtain permits shall be paid for by the COUNTY.

3. To be responsible for all damage to persons or property caused by him, his agents, employees, or subcontractors, which may result from their operation in connection with the work.

4. To deliver to the COUNTY all tracings, the necessary set of prints, and to make available to the COUNTY at any time all field notes taken in the preparation of plans for said project.

SECTION II

THE COUNTY AGREES

Paragraph Four

The COUNTY agrees:

That the ENGINEER has been duly authorized to make all said surveys, plans, specifications, and estimates, including the performance of all necessary services and the furnishing of all labor, equipment, materials and supplies essential thereto, for the fee as stipulated.

Paragraph Five

It is further understood and agreed by the said COUNTY that this agreement and all contracts which are entered into under the provisions of this agreement shall be binding upon the present governing body of said COUNTY and their successors.

Paragraph Six

It is further understood that the ENGINEER will arrange for obtaining the necessary soils investigation which is included in this contract.

SECTION III

THE PARTIES HERETO MUTUALLY AGREE

Paragraph Seven

It is mutually agreed by the parties hereto:

-

1. That the Services to be performed by the ENGINEER under the terms of this agreement are personal and cannot be assigned, sublet or transferred without the written consent of said COUNTY.

2. That the right is reserved by the COUNTY to terminate this agreement at any time, upon written notice, in the event the improvements are to be abandoned or indefinitely postponed; provided, however, that in any case the ENGINEER shall be paid for the reasonable value of the services rendered up to the time of termination on the basis of the payment provisions of this agreement but in no case greater than the lump sum fees stipulated on Page 1 of the Agreement. The parties recognize that services terminated prior to completion will be of less value to the COUNTY than services completed pursuant to the terms of the contract.

3. That payment by the COUNTY as hereinbefore provided is contingent upon approval of the plans, specifications, and estimates by the COUNTY.

4. That "SPECIFICATIONS" as mentioned in said agreement shall be construed to mean the applicable sections of the Standard Specifications of the Kansas Department of Transportation and approved supplemental specifications applicable to said improvements.

 That surveys as identified in this agreement cover design surveys only. Right of way staking will be by the county.

6. The ENGINEER agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, or physical handicaps in regard to any position for which the employee or applicant is qualified. The ENGINEER will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, or physical handicap.

7. All work product of ENGINEER will become the property of the COUNTY exclusively and will be promptly delivered to the COUNTY upon completion of ENGINEER's services or earlier termination thereof.
