PUBLIC HEARINGS AND OPENING OF ANNOUNCED BIDS MESSAGES FROM THE COUNTY LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH MESSAGES FROM THE PUBLIC MESSAGES FROM OTHER GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES MESSAGES FROM APPOINTED OFFICIALS

Item One: Mr. Troy Graham presented a Motion of Recommendation for a Conditional Land Use CL 17-1404 for the establishment of a new event center to be known as the "Circle B Ranch" with stipulations listed. Mr. Graham stated that this has been approved by the Crawford County Zoning and Planning Board. He explained that all the stipulations set out in the motion have been completed. Mr. Graham stated that Mr. Jason Bailey is the applicant and he is present with his attorney Mr. Kevin Mitchelson. He explained that there were only 3 adjacent landowners within 1000 feet and the landowners were all notified. He informed the Commission of the location and showed the location on the map. Mr. Graham said that the parking lot will be gravel but the handicap stalls will be concreted with a sidewalk. There was a discussion on having a sprinkler system installed in the building and what requirements could be set out by the Fire Marshall in requiring a system. Mr. Kevin Mitchelson introduced himself and introduced Dr. Jason Bailey to the Commissioners. Mr. Mitchelson gave some background information on the reasons why Dr. Bailey and his wife, Jennifer, started this event center. Dr. Bailey stated at this time he feels that he may only hold 3 or 4 events a year. Mr. Murphy stated that one of his concerns is vehicles traveling down 570th Ave with the road not being in very good condition and suggested an alternative route to the center.

MOTION OF RECOMMENDATION

A motion was made by Bonnie Houk and seconded by Gary Edwards to send a recommendation of approval to the Crawford County Board of Commissioners for Conditional Land Use CLU 17-1404 for the establishment of a new event center to be known as the "Circle B Ranch" under the condition that the applicant must do the following:

- 1. Applicant must obtain separate water meter and account for Circle B Ranch at the request of Crawford County Rural Water #4.
- Applicant must provide a sketch of the current wastewater system (septic tank and lateral field) location to William Towery, Crawford County Registered Sanitarian.
- 3. Applicant must provide Crawford County Zoning Administrator Troy Graham with the location, size, and lighting of sign to be used on premises in accordance with Crawford County Zoning Regulations.

MESSAGES FROM ELECTED OFFICIALS

Item One: State Representative Adam Lusker addressed the Commissioners and gave an update on the legislative session this year. He stated that the budget was balanced and passed a tax revenue plan. Mr. Lusker explained the budget and tax plan. He addressed the education funding bill. He informed the Commissioners that State Employees received a 2% wage increase and explained this is the first increase in almost a decade for the State Employees. He feels the legislature is making strides in the right direction. Mr. Wood asked questions on a Senate Bill 155 from a few years ago and Mr. Lusker stated he will get more information on this. There was a discussion on horse racing and dog racing. Mr. Lusker discussed transportation projects and T Works. Mr. Murphy addressed

the Watco Trail and explained the location of the trail. There was a discussion on road at 210th street north of Atkinson that Frontenac, Pittsburg and the County each own a side and the issue of working on this intersection. The Commissioners thanked Representative Lusker for his hard work in the legislature.

PROCLAMATION AND ORDERS OF THE BOARD NEW BUSINESS

Item One: County Clerk Don Pyle presenting the June 2017 Clerk's Report. Mr. Pyle stated that this report summarizes the total amounts spent by departments for payroll and bills during the month of June. Mr. Pyle also gave the Commissioners a copy of the May 2017 to June 2017 Clerk's Report of Changes in Expenditures for comparison. Mr. Pyle reviewed the changes with the Commissioners and discussed some of the reasons for the changes. There was a discussion on property, casualty and work comp insurance and the Commissioners and the County Counselor being contacted and kept informed of the status of claims and other situations. There was also a discussion on the risk management fund.

Presentation of County Clerk's Report to the Board of County Commissioners confirmation of the same report, the allowance of claims and audit authorizing the issuance of orders (warrants) in payment of the claims allowed including the approval of county payroll.

He stated he researched Community Corrections Employee insurance coverage and explained how they are paid and what coverages the employees have. The Commissioners decided that Community Correction Employees that have a single plan will incur the additional costs. The Commissioners discussed employees that are covered under the lowest tier of insurance coverage. It was decided that retirees will pay the increase set out for employees with income of \$35,000 or less and employees that are currently covered under the lowest tier will incur the additional costs as set out in Motion 2017-218.

Item Three: Mr. Emerson presented Contractor's Payment Estimate No. 2 from Cook Flatt and Strobel Engineers on Bridge Replacement Bridge #690 in the amount of \$54,741.60 for Mission Construction Company, Contractor. The Commissioners agreed to pay this out of the Special Bridge Fund.
