# MESSAGES FROM THE COUNTY LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH MESSAGES FROM THE PUBLIC MESSAGES FROM OTHER GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES

**Item One:** Ms. Rebecca Brubaker. Executive Director, Safehouse Crisis Resource Center presented the Commissioners with the Emergency Solution Grant (ESG) Application for the Program year 2017. to close the Coffeyville shelter and explained the reasoning why it was closed and what took place. Ms. Brubaker gave the Commissioners some information on the current Pittsburg shelter and spoke about the new facility being constructed in Pittsburg. She explained that they are not constructing a new building but completely refurbishing an existing large building. Ms. Brubaker stated that the new building will able to house men which currently men are housed in a hotel until a facility is found. Mr. Wood was answered that Safehouse Crisis Resource Center serves 7 counties in SE Kansas and that the average age of the clients served are in their 20's with small children. Ms. Brubaker stated that the new facility is a couple of months away from opening and addressed the security that will be in the new facility.

Safehouse (SCC) provides emergency shelter services to victims of domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking. The families that come into our program are unable to stay in their current housing due to the violence making them homeless and in need of a suitable living environment.

Our shelter is available/accessible to provide for these needs at no cost to all victims regardless of ethnicity, education level, economic status, sexual orientation, immigration status, geographic location, spiritual beliefs, physical or mental ability or criminal status. We provide housing, meals, and personal care items for residents along with kitchen and laundry facilities and supplies to meet their day-to-day needs. While in shelter, advocate staff work with the residents on safety planning, employment needs, disability needs, permanent housing, and provide advocacy through systems such as health care, law enforcement, and court.

### MESSAGES FROM APPOINTED OFFICIALS

**Item One:** Mr. Jason VanBecelaere, Crawford County Emergency Manager, presented Resolution #2017-013, a Resolution and Proclamation of a State of Local Disaster Emergency for Crawford County, Kansas. Mr. VanBecelaere explained how the disaster emergency funds are allocated and that the he is not sure at this time if the damages from the recent rains and flooding will qualify for funds but if the Proclamation is not done Crawford County will not qualify for assistance if needed. Mr. VanBecelaere reported on the areas that were flooded and some of the damages from the excessive rain and showed a slide presentation of some of the areas. He stated that there were no water rescues but 5 vehicles and 1 semi-truck that was stranded due to the water. He explained that these vehicles went around barricades. He also showed a video that Mr. Graham had taken with his drone showing a truck that was stranded in the water and showed how the drone was able to fly close enough to vehicle to show that it was unoccupied. Mr. VanBecelaere discussed barricades and signage for the flooded roads. There was a discussion on how drones could help out in emergency situations. The Commissioners and Mr. VanBecelaere discussed the flooding of county roads and the damages caused.

RESOLUTION # 2017-013 AND PROCLAMATION

PROCLAMATION of a State of Local Disaster Emergency for CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS

WHEREAS on the 29 April 2017, the Board of Commissioners of CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS finds that certain conditions have caused, or eminently threated to cause wide-spread or severe damage, injury or loss of life or property in disaster proportion in CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS;

WHEREAS, such conditions have created obstruction which endanger health, safety and welfare of persons and proper with the border of CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS:

That the Board of County Commissioners of CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS under and be virtue of the authority vested in it by K.S.A.1976 Supp. 48-932, does hereby PROCLAIM that a State of Local Disaster Emergency exists.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND PROCLAIMED that the area within the border of CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS covered by this proclamation / resolution is the entire area of CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said Board has all rights and/ or powers to perform such functions as are vested in said Board by and through the provisions of the Kansas Emergency Preparedness Act of 1975.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED AND PROCLAIMED that this resolution shall remain in effect for a period of seven (7) days unless terminated earlier or renewed by consent of the governing body.
