All three Commissioners stated they thought this would be a good operation.

BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS CRAWFORD COUNTY, KANSAS

Resolution 2017-028

WHEREAS, a petition has been filed by Prairie Garden Produce 107 W. 2nd Street, Franklin, Kansas to amend, change or modify the existing use on property described herein and to request a conditional land use to allow for a new development which would be used as a greenhouse and fresh market. The location address of the development would be 107 W. 2nd Street, Franklin, Kansas. A complete legal description of the property can be found in the Crawford County Zoning office 111 E. Forest Girard, Kansas during normal business hours.

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on October 19, 2017 on said application by the Crawford County Planning and Zoning Board, after due notice in accordance with the Crawford County Regional Zoning Regulations.

WHEREAS, as a result of said public hearing, the Crawford County Planning & Zoning Board did recommend approval of the Zoning Conditional Land Use. The recommendation is based on the following:

- a. Use would be conducive to the area.
- b. Use would be suitable, and
- c. Be in the same general character of the neighborhood.

WHEREAS, the undersigned members of the Board of County Commissioners, upon review of the Zoning case file and based on the recommendation presented by the Zoning Administrator, do hereby recommend the change for the Conditional Land Use, as presented from the Planning & Zoning Board. Along with the approval the following stipulations shall be placed on the Conditional Use:

- 1) Said use would be for a greenhouse and fresh market only.
- 2) The placement of a mobile home on the property is approved for office use only and not to be used as a permanent residence.
- 3) If use of the facility changes from what was presented to the County Commissioners, then a new Conditional Use shall be obtained.

WHEREAS, on November 3, 2017, the Crawford County Zoning Administrator presented recommendation for the Conditional Land Use from the Crawford County Planning and Zoning Board to the Board of County Commissioners.

WHEREAS, the undersigned members of the Board of County Commissioners, upon review of the minutes of the aforementioned public hearing, do hereby approve the Conditional Land Use.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Crawford County, Kansas:

Section 1: The findings of the Planning and Zoning Board as outlined above are hereby adopted and the Conditional Land Use for a greenhouse and fresh market is hereby approved along with noted stipulations.

Section 2: The official zoning maps and records for Crawford County, Kansas, shall be amended to reflect the change as approved in Section 1 above.

Section 3: This resolution will take effect upon its signing and publication in the legal section of the official county newspaper.



Item Two: The Commissioners and Mr. Graham discussed some properties in the county that are in need of clean up.

MESSAGES FROM ELECTED OFFICIALS PROCLAMATION AND ORDERS OF THE BOARD NEW BUSINESS

Item One: Mr. Jim Emerson, County Counselor, informed the Commissioner about a presentation about the shooting in Heston, Kansas in February 2016. He stated that the presentation is called "A Day of Tragedy: Lessons Learned from the Excel Industries Shooting" which will be presented on November 29, 2017 from 9:00 AM to Noon at the Bicknell Family Center for the Arts. He stated that he has heard that this is a very good presentation and he plans on attending. Mr. Moody would like all elected officials and department heads be aware of the meeting. The Commissioners discussed the current

emergency plan in place at the courthouse and also discussed an emergency plan and training for all county buildings with the employees. The Commissioners will check with Mr. VanBecelaere on this issue.



Item Two: Commissioner Murphy stated that Mr. Ed Fields spoke with him about his concerns with the Christmas Tree that was planted in the Courtyard and that he felt that running extension cords to the gazebo for the lights would be unsafe. He said that Mr. Fields stated that a conduit needs to be buried with an outlet. The Commissioners agreed

but are not sure if there is time to do it for this year. The Commissioners discussed where to place the conduit. Commissioner Wood will check into this.

Item Three: Mr. Murphy stated he is not happy with the quality of the parking blocks in the courthouse parking lot and stated they are chipped and not flat on the bottom. Commissioner Moody stated that he is concerned with the angle they were placed at. The Commissioners discussed painting the blocks. The Commissioners agreed that the blocks are sufficient for the price paid. Mr. Murphy stated that they are not anchored down yet but will be.

Item Four: Mr. Murphy reported on an employee that spoke to him in reference to the wellness program and how it has helped him improve his health conditions.

Item Five: Mr. Wood stated that Westar will be doing a presentation on November 16, 2017 at Pittsburg Fire Station #1 and there will be a session in the morning and a session in the afternoon. He said that he does not want to make it mandatory unless the employee has not yet attended a session. He also said that if the employee has already attended the sessions they may also attend again if they wish to. Mr. Wood stated that he needs a headcount for the presentation. He stated that there will be employees attending from the Sheriff's Department and the EMS Department. The foremen will contact Mr. Wood with the number of employees from their district that will be attending.

Item Six: Mr. Wood discussed the new trucks for the foremen and stated that he is waiting on bids from the local dealership and if does not hear from the dealerships soon he would like to go ahead with the state bid.

Item Seven: Mr. Wood discussed the Centennial Bridge project and reported on the progress.

UNDER THE HEADING OLD BUSINESS

Item One: County Clerk Don Pyle presenting the October 2017 Clerk's Report. Mr. Pyle stated that this report summarizes the total amounts spent by departments for payroll and bills during the month of October. Mr. Pyle also gave the Commissioners a copy of the September 2017 to October 2017 Clerk's Report of Changes in Expenditures for comparison. Mr. Pyle reviewed the changes with the Commissioners and discussed some of the reasons for the changes. There was a lengthy discussion about road & bridge and special bridge funds.

Presentation of County Clerk's Report to the Board of County Commissioners confirmation of the same report, the allowance of claims and audit authorizing the issuance of orders (warrants) in payment of the claims allowed including the approval of county payroll.
