

MESSAGES FROM ELECTED OFFICIALS PROCLAMATION AND ORDERS OF THE BOARD NEW BUSINESS

Item One: County Clerk Don Pyle stated that the he received an email from Mr. Randy Sandburg, EMS Director requesting the Commissioner's approval for the purchase of an ambulance remount. Mr. Pyle stated that Mr. Sandburg said he would like to pick up the ambulance on Monday and would like a check cut today to take with him. The Commissioners were concerned with the purchase and the EMS budget. Mr. Emerson stated that when the EMS budget was approved the Commissioners gave the department the approval to purchase this. The Commissioners gave approval to cut the check today for Mr. Sandburg to purchase the ambulance remount. The Commissioners would like Mr. Sandburg to meet with them on Tuesday at 9:00 AM for a work session to give a report on ambulance runs and collections.

LEASE AND OPTION TO PURCHASE

THIS AGREEMENT is made this 27th day of October, 2017 by and between The First National Bank of Girard, Girard, Kansas (hereinafter referred to as "Lessor"), and the Crawford County Road and Bridge Department (hereafter called "Lessee").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Lessee wishes to obtain the use and benefit of the below described equipment which it does not own through an agreement with the Lessor; and

WHEREAS, the Lessor desires to provide the funding which will make the purchase of equipment possible.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Lessor agrees to lease to the Lessee the following described property:
 - A. (1) 2018 Freightliner Dump Truck VIN #1FVHG5FE6JHJR3311
- 2. The Lessor makes no warranty or representation, either expressed or implied, as to the value, design, condition, merchantability or fitness for particular purpose or fitness for use of the equipment, or warranty with respect thereto. In no event shall the Lessor be liable for any incidental, indirect, special or consequential damage in connection with or arising out of this agreement or the existence, furnishing, functioning or the Lessee's use of the equipment or any item thereof or services provided. Further, the Lessee agrees to hold the Lessor harmless for any said damage arising out of this Agreement or the existence, furnishing, functioning or the Lessee's use of the equipment or any item thereof or service provided.
- 3. At its own expense, the Lessee shall cause casualty and liability insurance to be carried or maintained on the equipment sufficient to protect the Full Insurable Value (meaning the full replacement value (new) of the equipment or the then applicable purchase price, whichever is less). All insurance shall name the Lessee and the Lessor as loss payees as their respective interest may appear.
- At its own expense, the Lessee shall pay all taxes owed on said equipment, if any, and agrees to hold the Lessor harmless from the payment of any said taxes.
- 5. The term of this Lease shall commence this day, and shall continue for a period of Twenty Four (24) months, which shall be no later than November 1st, 2019 ("Termination Date") unless terminated pursuant to Paragraph 7 below.

6. The Lessee shall pay a monthly rent for the lease of said equipment in the amount of \$5,247.82 beginning December 1st, 2017 and to continue each and every month until termination date. On termination, November 1st, 2019 the final payment shall be approximately \$5,243.80.

The Lessee is obligated only to pay periodic payments or annual installments under this lease as may lawfully be made from (a) funds budgeted and appropriated for that purpose during the County's current budget year or (b) funds made available from any lawfully operated revenue producing source.

- a. Cash purchase price: \$123,728.50
- b. Annual average effective interest cost: 1.690% APR
- c. Service, maintenance, insurance and other charges; None
- 7. The Lease term will terminate upon the earliest occurrence of either of the following events:
 - (a) The expiration of the Lease Term on the Termination Date, with the Lessee having the right to purchase the equipment as described in paragraph 8.
 - (b) In the event sufficient funds shall not be budgeted and appropriated by the Lessee for any Fiscal Year sufficient in the amount to provide for the rental required hereunder for such fiscal year in order to continue the leasing of the equipment, or for any other obligation of the Lessee under this lease during the lease term, then the Lessee shall terminate this lease pursuant to this subsection by so notifying the Lessor; and the Lessee shall not be obligated to make payments of the rental required by this lease beyond the end of the period for which the Lessee has budgeted therefore subsequent to the end of the then current fiscal year. The Lessee agrees to deliver written notice to the Lessor of a termination of the lease under provisions of this subsection within thirty (30) days after the Lessee's failure to budget and appropriate for the rental in the ordinary course of its business, and the Lessee shall surrender the equipment to the Lessor on the last day of the last period for which moneys for the payment of the rental have been appropriated and/or made. In the event the Lessee fails to make the required rental when it becomes due or within a reasonable time thereafter, or terminates the lease pursuant to this paragraph, the exclusive remedy of the Lessor shall be to enter and remove the equipment from the County premises and to retain all sums previously paid by Lessee. In the event Lessee terminates this agreement pursuant to this paragraph, Lessee shall not expend funds for equipment similar to the subject equipment for one (1) year.

- 8. Provided the Lessee is not in default hereunder, it may elect to purchase the said equipment at the end of the term of this agreement for the purchase price of One Dollars and No/100 (\$1.00).
- 9. This agreement shall not be modified, altered, changed or amended in any respect unless in writing and signed by both parties.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have executed this agreement this 27th day of October, 2017, the same shall be considered binding upon both parties and shall remain in full force and effect unless and until canceled according to the terms of this agreement.

The motion prevailed.

Item Four: Mr. Emerson spoke about the Off-System Bridge Program through the State of Kansas. He stated that Mr. Randy Chiartano and CFS Engineers submitted applications for Crawford County for 4 bridges and only 1 bridge application was successful. Mr. Emerson stated that Mr. Kenny Blair with CFS stated that there were a lot of applications submitted this round and the County is lucky to get approval of the one bridge. He explained that the bridge located on 580th Avenue between 20th Street and 30th Street was

selected for funding and that a Form 1302 is needed for the project. He explained the form 1302 is a Project Programing Request Form and it shows that the project costs are estimated to be \$520,000 of which the state will pay 80% and the County will pay 20% or \$104,000. Mr. Emerson explained what items are not included in the match and will be 100% of the County's responsibility. He stated that the for 1302 will need to be submitted within the 30-day time line and also presented an agreement with CFS to do the design engineering on the bridge for \$38,000. Commissioner Murphy would like Mr. Blair from CFS engineers to speak with the Commissioners before signing any paperwork. Mr. Emerson will contact Mr. Blair.

Item Five: Commissioner Moody stated that he received a letter from the City of Arma with concerns about the dangerous intersection at 640th Avenue and US 69 Highway. He stated that in the last 17 years there have been 69 accidents, 2 deaths and 30 injuries at that intersection and that something needs to be done. Mr. Moody said that he would like to schedule a work session with a representative from the KDOT, the City of Arma Governing Body, the Commissioners and the State Legislators to see what can be done to alleviate this problem. Commissioner Moody explained that this problem is not going away and it is a very dangerous intersection. Mr. Emerson will work on setting up the work session.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

The City Council of the City of Arma, Kansas, is requesting any and all assistance and/or reviews that can be made to assist in resolving what the City considers to be a very dangerous intersection. The intersection of 640th Avenue and US 69 in Crawford County, Kansas, has had a history of creating significant collisions, not only resulting in death and serious injury, but also in property damage. At this point in time, because the City does not have a grocery store within the East side of the town, it is necessary for many of the citizens to cross US 69 at the 640th Avenue intersection to shop at the Dollar General located on the West side of US 69. This has created additional complications with people that are trying to enter the Dollar General parking lot, as well as crossing the intersection for other purposes.

We have attached a printout that was obtained showing a history of the accidents at that intersection. Not only has the intersection historically had complications, but with the partial improvement of US 69 four lane North of the Crawford County line, we are seeing an increased traffic flow, which we anticipate will continue to increase as the US 69 improvement continues. We visualize at this time, the funneling of four lane traffic onto two lanes of traffic on US 69 in Crawford County will result in additional traffic complications and/or impediments for persons that wish to cross the 640th Avenue and US 69 intersection.

Because a four lane road exists South of Arma which ends at the US 56/69 Junction, and then will be resuming to a four lane at the Crawford County line North of Arma, the funneling effect will continue to increase until the US 69 improvement from Crawford County border South is finally approved.

The City Council believes that a traffic light at the intersection of 640th Avenue and US 69 is necessary to allow protected access, not only for crossing the highway, but also to enter the highway coming from either the East or the West on 640th Avenue.

We are seeking any and all assistance you can provide us to assist the City in obtaining this life protecting and property saving necessity. Should you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Mayor of the City of Arma, or any City Councilman to discuss this matter.

Item Six: Mr. Moody stated that he has 2 trucks in very poor shape. He explained that one of the trucks has no heat or AC and the floorboard is totally rotted out. He stated he would like to purchase a replacement truck and that he found a white service truck ri4 around \$10,000 to \$11,000 with approximately 100,000 miles. The Commissioners discussed trading in the old trucks or selling them on Purple Wave. Mr. Moody stated that the other truck will be replaced when the foreman truck is handed down.

On motion (17-361) of Commissioner Moody and the second of Commissioner Wood to approve the purchase of a pickup truck for Road and Bridge District #2 not to exceed the price of \$11,000.

Item Seven: Commissioner Murphy addressed purchasing a tree trimmer. Mr. Pyle showed a video clip of a Baumalight Incisor tree trimmer. Mr. Murphy stated that this trimmer should attach to one of the county's excavators. The Commissioners discussed the different types of trimmers and what they will do. Mr. Murphy stated that Foley Equipment is a dealer for this type of trimmer and he will speak to them and check on a price and see if it will fit one of the County's excavators.

UNDER THE HEADING OLD BUSINESS

Item One: Mr. Pyle presented the Commissioners with the bound copies of the Employee Policy Manual. Mr. Pyle stated that the manuals will be distributed to current employees at the Benefits Fair and there will be extra copies for any new employees that are hired. The Commissioners stated that the manuals look very nice.

Item Two: Mr. Pyle addressed IMA and stated that they will be going back to BC/BS with the new plan design. Mr. Pyle showed the Proposed 2018 Plan Design Changes and discussed these changes with the Commissioners.

Item Three: Mr. Murphy addressed Codes Court and the Commissioners would like Mr. Troy Graham, Zoning Administrator to attend a Commission meeting periodically to give an update on Codes Court. Mr. Wood stated that he feels that Codes Courts needs to be done as soon as possible. The Commissioners discussed some properties that are in horrible shape and need cleaned up. Mr. Murphy suggested that Mr. Tim Fielder speak with the Commissioners as he deals with these situations for a couple of the cities in Crawford County. Mr. Moody will speak with Mr. Graham.

Item Four: Mr. Emerson presented the Conflict of Interest Policy. He stated that this policy is needed for the State Emergency Shelter Grant and that it is a good thing to have on file.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

The Board of County Commissioners hereby adopts the following conflict of interest policy.

Purpose: The purpose of this Policy is to ensure that employees identify and disclose potential Conflicts of Interest, and conduct themselves in a manner that will not compromise the integrity of the County.

Scope: This Policy applies to any person who is an employee, agent, consultant, officer, or elected official or appointed official of the County. (hereinafter collectively referred to as "employee".)

Definitions:

- Conflict of Interest An actual Conflict of Interest occurs when financial or personal considerations compromise an individual's objectivity, professional judgment, and/or ability to perform his/her duties for the County. The following non-exclusive list provides examples of situations that often give arise to an actual or potential Conflict of Interest
- An employee...
 - has an ownership interest in an entity with which the County does business;
 - receives significant salary or other compensation from an entity/individual with which/whom the County does business;
 - 3. receives individual gifts or individual discounts from an entity /individual with which/whom the County does business, when the donor's intent is to influence such individual in the performance of his/her official duties;
 - 4. is an officer, director, or other key decision maker for an entity with which the County does business;
 - receives significant commissions or fees as part of an outside business from a customer/client with which the County does business;
 - 6. has a family member or close personal relationship with someone who fits into one of the categories described above.
- 1. Disclosure of Interests: Employees are responsible for disclosing potential conflicts of interest to their supervisors for review and determination of the appropriate course of action. An employee may be required by his/her supervisor to complete a written disclosure form in connection with the employee's involvement in making decisions on behalf of the County. In determining whether an interest needs to be disclosed, employees

should err on the side of caution and construe this policy broadly in favor of disclosure.

- 2. Agreements, Contracts and Purchases: County employees shall not knowingly promote and/or enter into any agreement, contract or other binding business relationship on behalf of the county when a Conflict of Interest exists. Examples include, but are not limited to, purchase agreements for goods, services, leases, grant contracts, memoranda of understanding, letter/arrangement agreements, commitments, etc. A Conflict of Interest shall preclude an employee from participating in the selection and negotiation, or in any other decision-making processes.
- 3. Gifts: County employees who participate in selecting vendors, products and contractors should avoid accepting individual gifts and individual discounts from outside individuals and entities that are existing or potential vendors or contractors when it is clear that the donor's intent is to influence an employee's official duties. Occasional meals or beverages are acceptable as long as they are not conditioned upon the employee taking official action on behalf of the county. An employee who believes he/she may have accepted a gift giving rise to an actual or perceived Conflict of Interest, should notify his/her supervisor pursuant to this Policy.
- 4. Restraint on Participation: With respect to a particular transaction or item of business, if an employee is deemed by the supervisor to have an actual or perceived Conflict of Interest, that employee shall not participate in the decision for which he/she has the Conflict of Interest.
- 5. Disciplinary Action: Violators of this Policy are subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination of employment.
